#### Summary Paragraph

The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District is a residential neighborhood located in northeastern Baltimore City, an area that was part of Baltimore County prior to its suburban development. The triangular-shaped community is bounded on the southeast side by Harford Road, a highly traveled route leading directly into downtown Baltimore. The six-lane road divides the neighborhood from Clifton Park and Clifton Park Golf Course, which are located to the southeast. The southwestern boundary is created by those buildings fronting the west side of The Alameda. On this side of The Alameda, those row houses fronting Kennedy Avenue, East 28<sup>th</sup> Street, and East 29<sup>th</sup> Street, terminating at and including Kirk Avenue, form the westernmost border, abutting the Homestead Village neighborhood to the southwest and the campus of Baltimore City College to the northwest. The Alameda is divided by medians that provide landscaping with shade trees and flowering plantings. Although physically dividing the neighborhood, the medians visually and socially unite the two areas by serving as parkland. East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street is the northern boundary. To the north of Kirk Avenue, which runs diagonally, the northwest boundary includes those properties on the east side of The Alameda. East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street also has landscaped medians with shade trees as it runs between Hillen Road and The Alameda. The area to the north between these streets is improved with suburban Colonial Revival-style single-family dwellings. The Montebello School and the filtration plant at Lake Montebello are located to the north of the historic district on East 32<sup>nd</sup> Street, to the east of Hillen Road. Hillen Triangle, ornamented with an imposing bronze statue of theologian Martin Luther, unites East 32<sup>nd</sup> and 33<sup>rd</sup> Streets as they follow the natural typography; this park in not included within the historic district. The smaller Montebello Park, complete with a basketball court, mature trees, and paved walkways, fronts Harford Road, with Jenifer Avenue and East 29<sup>th</sup> Street at its northern corner.

The historic district is set on a high plateau overlooking Clifton Park to its southeast and Lake Montebello to its northeast; Baltimore City College overlooks the neighborhood from the northwest side. The slope of the site enables houses on one side of the same street to be raised slightly above those on the opposite side of the street, often giving the impression of additional stories. The rectilinear-laid blocks are framed by narrow streets, each with on-street parking and tree-lined sidewalks of concrete. Traffic alternates in one direction on the east-west and north-south streets, with very narrow alleys running through the blocks. The multi-laned Hillen Road is at the approximate center of the neighborhood, traveling north-south to connect with East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to the north and Harford Road to the south.

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The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District was created and improved by several developers. Dr. Theodore Cooke constructed the eastern portion of the district, bound by Hillen Road to the west, Harford Road to the south and east, and East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to the north. Frank Novak Realty Company constructed the western section of the district, bound by The Alameda and Kirk Avenue to the west, 29<sup>th</sup> Street to the south, Hillen Road to the east, and 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to the north. Rochester-Kirkness Realty Company, Joseph H. White Realty, and Broring Building Company developed the southwestern section of the neighborhood. Although the construction of the entire historic district spanned a fifteen-year period, the developers all built brick row houses, which through their architectural expressions, ornamentation, materials, setbacks, and massing present a cohesive neighborhood. The two types of row houses, reflecting housing needs before and after World War I, represent the porch-front rows of the Artistic period (1875-1915) and daylight rows of the Daylight period (1915-1955).

The oldest of the row houses, dating from 1909 to 1920, are located in the southern part of the neighborhood from East 28<sup>th</sup> Street southward to the intersection of The Alameda and Harford Road, including those on the west side of The Alameda. Another grouping dating from this same period is located in the northeast corner of the neighborhood, marking the intersection of Harford Road with East 32<sup>nd</sup> Street. These are examples of the Artistic period, with classically inspired architectural elements, full-width front porches, and oriel windows projecting from the second stories of the facades. Streets more centrally located in the neighborhood, reflecting the shorter yet wider buildings of the Daylight period, date from the early 1920s with a few row houses erected in the late 1920s. The row houses from the north side of East 32<sup>nd</sup> Street to East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street, west of Hillen Road, were constructed in the late 1920s through to 1937. Contemporaneous corner and rows of commercial buildings are found along Hillen Road; corner commercial buildings once populated the neighborhood to a greater extent but most of the buildings have been razed or rehabilitated for another use. The small triangular lot created by Hillen Road, Harford Road, and Montebello Park has two freestanding commercial buildings designed and constructed by chain stores. These buildings replaced imposing freestanding singlefamily dwellings, which stood at 2910 to 2924 Harford Road-the latter now Montebello Park.

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#### **Narrative Description**

The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District is made up of streets lined with row houses. Reflecting the architectural fashions of the 1910s to just before World War II, the row houses are eclectically adorned with elements of the Classical Revival, Colonial Revival, and Italianate styles. Those buildings fronting East 32<sup>nd</sup> and 33<sup>rd</sup> Streets, The Alameda, and Harford Road are more ornate than those on the interior streets. Generally bounding the historic district, these streets are highly traveled and the application of high-style architectural ornamentation associated with the Classical Revival and Colonial Revival styles would have been used as a means to advertise the fashionable new neighborhood. These two styles were favored in the city of Baltimore, embraced by the nationally acclaimed architectural firm of McKim, Mead & White and exhibited widely at the 1893 Chicago World's Fair. These first row houses reflect what is described in The Baltimore Rowhouse as the Artistic period. The interior streets, especially those developing from the 1910s and 1920s, were influenced more by the Italianate style, which had been the preferred style for row houses in the late nineteenth century and therefore was a commonly recognized architectural expression, especially in Baltimore. As development progressed northward from East 28<sup>th</sup> Street to Chilton and East 33<sup>rd</sup> Streets, the classical vocabulary once again adorned the row houses. These latter houses reflect the Daylight period.

The rows are set back from the streets, which are edged by concrete-paved sidewalks. Each dwelling is reached by a walk of concrete and is landscaped by a grassed front yard, which is sometimes enclosed with chain-link fencing. Depending on the street and slope of the site, front porches are reached by only a few steps or elevated above grassy berms and therefore accessed by multiple steps. The stairs are concrete, stone-veneered, or wood; the original stair material was not discernible due to the variety of replacement materials and may have varied from street to street. Metal rails edge the stairs to the front porches; some have replacement wood rails or no balustrades. Rear yards extend from the main block to the narrow alleys that run parallel to each of the major east-west streets. The rear elevations of the houses typically have one-story projecting entry bays or overhanging oriel windows, many enlarged by modest additions. Rear yards are commonly enclosed with chain link fences. One-story garages, which were not original elements of the neighborhood, line the alleys at the rear of many of the properties and front the north-south streets.

The row houses of the historic district are two stories in height, set on slightly exposed basements; the exposed basements often read as a full story due to the sloping typography of the neighborhood. The masonry buildings are constructed of brick that is typically laid in all-stretcher bond. The machine-finished brick is smooth and pressed on the facades; the bricks are generally of a standard size although narrower Roman bricks were used on the facades of houses in the 2000 block (even) of East 30<sup>th</sup> Street. Red brick is commonly utilized throughout the neighborhood, often painted or stuccoed on the side and/or rear elevations. Blonde brick veneers the facades of the row houses fronting East 29<sup>th</sup> Street, which was improved in the early 1920s. (Photo # 11) A number of rear elevations have been reclad in aluminum or vinyl siding; examples along East 28<sup>th</sup> Street are constructed of wood frame on the second stories of the rear

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elevations. Textured asphalt shingles and synthetic siding commonly adorn oriel windows. Stone veneering is used on the foundations of some porches and main blocks of the buildings from the 1920s to 1930s; the religious edifices are all finished in stone cladding along the principal facades. The flat roofs of the row houses slope slightly to the rear, with stylized entablatures of wood or metal ornamenting the facades. Variation is provided by stepped parapets or false mansard roofs, which were originally clad in terra cotta tiles with a modern Spanish shape. Exposed side elevations of corner and end buildings are generally finished with corbelled brick cornices and metal coping. Low brick firewalls, interrupted by interior brick chimneys, divide the row houses. The buildings are three bays wide, ranging in width from 12 feet to 20 feet. Fenestration is symmetrical on the facades and rear elevations, with openings asymmetrically placed on the side elevations as the interior spaces dictated. The single-leaf entry openings are located in the end bays of the facades and rear elevations, generally topped by fixed transoms. Window openings are double-hung, originally holding 1/1 wood sash set on smooth-finished concrete sills; replacement sash is 1/1 vinyl, a few with false 6/6 muntins. The windows are single and paired. Openings on the facades vary depending on the row house design from segmental to jack arch with two- and three-course rowlock brick lintels or smooth-finished lug lintels of concrete; the latter more commonly found on the building facades rather than side or rear elevations. The first-story openings on the row houses fronting Harford Road are elongated and notably wide. The original window was a 1/1 sash flanked by very narrow operable 1/1 windows that read as sidelights. The slightly exposed basements are pierced by single and paired openings with a variety of window types, including hopper, fixed, double-hung, and glass blocks; the original sash appears to have been hopper.

Dating from 1913, the Classical Revival-inspired row houses in the 2800 block of Harford Road present some of the most stylistic applied ornamentation. The buildings, representative of the Artistic period, are set on raised foundation and veneered in all-stretcher-bond brick. Each single-family dwelling is two bays wide, a fenestration pattern created by a single-leaf entry opening in the northern end bay and a wide window opening in the southern end bay. This elongated window holds paired 1/1 sash with narrow surrounds, wide mullion, and ogee-molded lintel that extends to the bed molding of the porch roof. The end unit at 2800 Harford Road has a single 1/1 window in this large opening and is further embellished with an oriel window on the side elevation facing The Alameda. The entries into the row houses on this street are topped by jack-arched transoms with narrow surrounds. The two-bay entry porches, originally supported by solid brick foundations pierced with paired window openings, have brick piers with ornate balustrades between. Many of the balustrades have been replaced, providing individuality to the nearly identical row of houses. The end units of each row have solid brick balustrades. The supports atop the brick piers vary, which is a treatment that is original as indicated by the frieze of the shed roofs of the porches. The supports include square posts and Tuscan columns. The second stories are dominated by wood-frame oriel windows that rest on the porch roofs. The three-sided, canted oriels have 1/1 sash; the flanking windows are slightly narrower that the window on the face of the oriel. Many of the openings retain the shared sill that reads also as a string course. A shared architrave runs above the openings, completed by a paneled frieze and overhanging cornice. The ogee-molded zinc cornice has scrolled modillions and scrolled end brackets that extend from the fire walls between each pair of dwellings. The friezes flanking the oriel windows have molded architraves with applied roundels. A number of the single-family

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units making up the rows on Harford Road have oriel windows now clad in asphalt shingles or vinyl siding. Some cornices no longer retain their modillions or separating brackets. Despite the alterations, the fenestration patterns, window configurations, and stylistic influences remain fully evident. (Photo #19)

Similar examples are found along The Alameda, Hugo Avenue, Tivoly and Fenwick Avenues (south of East 28<sup>th</sup> Street), and East 31<sup>st</sup> Street and East 32<sup>nd</sup> Street (east of Hillen Road). Although notably similar in form and massing, the ornamentation varies slightly. (Photos #1, 2, 3, and 6) For example, enclosed pediments rise over the porch entry on the rows from 2810 to 2852 Harford Road and in the 2000 block of East 31st Street. The rows from 2932 to 3136 Harford Road are slightly wider, extending three bays wide with narrow elongated window openings on the first story and entry openings in the southern end bays. These houses are also set back further from the road, on deep lots that allow for larger front and rear yards. The most stylistic embellishment is found along the roofline, which is finished with a flat parapet alternating with a pedimented parapet. The fire walls are marked by fluted brackets with bed molding and roundels on the frieze, and crowning segmental caps with a star motif. The flat parapets follow the canted massing of the oriels, with a lattice motif set in the panels. The pedimented parapets have plain antefix at the peak. The oriel windows are covered by a halfpyramidal roof of metal. An ogee-molded zinc cornice runs the full length of the rows, physically and visually uniting them. Marking the end of the development is the corner unit at 3136 Harford Road. The building is three bays wide, with two window openings and a singleleaf entry on the first story. The second story, unlike its attached neighbors, lacks the canted oriel window in favor of a semicircular arched opening with paired 1/1 sash and a rounded tower. Placed at the corner of the building, the tower is pierced by 1/1 windows with a continuous sill and lintel. It is topped by a conical roof of square-butt and fishscale slate shingles, which sits on an ogee-molded cornice.

Representing the Italianate influences popular for row house architecture nationally and in Baltimore during the Artistic period are the attached buildings along East 28<sup>th</sup> Street. (Photo #8) Two stories high, the structures are constructed of brick laid in all-stretcher-bond, with pressed brick on the facades. The rows were simultaneously constructed in the early 1920s, with each dwelling extending two bays wide (12 feet wide and 40 feet deep). The first story, marked by a side-entry opening and elongated window with transom, is sheltered by a two-bay front porch inspired by the Classical Revival style. The enclosed brick balustrades have two piers, the end pier supporting a Tuscan column of wood set under the ogee-molded cornice of the half-hipped porch roofs. The segmentally arched openings, complete with gauged arches composed of two brick courses, have 1/1 windows with concrete sills. One-light fixed transoms top the notably wide openings on the first story; a few of the openings have paired replacement sash that extends into the transom opening. The side-entry openings have two-light transoms with narrow molded surrounds and simple reveals. The stylized entablatures provide ornamentation indicative of the Italianate style. Stepped to show the individual units, and follow the contours of the sloping landscape, the entablatures are composed of an ogee-molded architrave visually connected to the wide overhang of the zinc cornice by thin scrolled brackets with fine pendent drops. The frieze is open, exposing the brick of the structure's façade. Complete with bed molding, the cornices are boxes with ogee molding; they are topped by metal coping and gutters. The end brackets that

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mark each unit have roundels on the faces at the cornice lines. Like contemporaneous row houses in the district, the corner or end units have cornice returns with brackets and corbeled bricks along the exposed side elevations. Similar examples are found in the 1600 blocks of East 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> Streets and along Kennedy Avenue.

Residential buildings representative of the Davlight period are found in the 1700-1900 blocks of East 29<sup>th</sup> Street, East 30<sup>th</sup> Street to the east of Hillen Road, and north from East 31<sup>st</sup> Street, inclusive. (Photo # 13) Measuring 20 feet wide and 40 feet deep, the row houses provided deeper front and rear yards, which are often landscaped with concrete walks set into berms. The examples in the 1700 block of East 29<sup>th</sup> Street are set upon a sloping berm, reached by concrete steps and short walks. The three-bay-wide facades are symmetrically fenestrated with segmentally arched openings, which are elongated on the first stories. The side-entry opening and one of the window openings of the first story of each unit is sheltered by a one-bay porch. The solid brick foundations have brick piers with tapering Tuscan columns supporting the halfhipped porch roofs. Some of the columns have been replaced with metal filigree posts. The balustrades are spiraled metal posts with molded rails. End units have solid balustrades of stone. The porches, reflecting the classically inspired revival styles, have wide friezes with narrow bed molding and overhanging boxed cornices with ogee molding. The main entries, many with replacement doors, have one-light fixed transoms. The window openings have 1/1 sash with concrete sills and two-course gauged brick arches. Unlike other similar row houses in the historic district, those fronting East 29<sup>th</sup> Street have blonde pressed brick facades. The brick is laid in allstretcher bond on the facades and five-course American bond on the side and rear elevations. The classically inspired cornices on the facades, which do not extend the full width, have ogeemolded architraves, wide friezes with bed molding, wide overhanging eaves with shallow modillions, and ogee-molded cornices. Alterations, albeit minimal, have included the removal of the modillions or the complete encapsulation of the entablatures in vinyl. The exposed side elevations have corbeled brick with ogee-molded metal coping.

Similar examples are found in the 1700 block of East 32<sup>nd</sup> Street, where the facades are laid in red pressed brick. The balustrades are brick with a variety of supports extending to the flat roofs of the porches. Another notable difference is the window openings on the second story, which recounts with interior configuration of this floor. A half window, holding a 1/1 sash, is located in the end bay over the entry opening. This smaller window illuminates the bath. The openings have rowlock brick sills and concrete lug lintels. The examples in the 1700-1900 blocks of East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street are also comparable, save the fenestration pattern. Pierced by single and paired openings, the row houses on this street are two bays wide, but measure slightly over 20 feet wide. The houses are set notably back from the street, sitting atop berms with brick steps. The one-bay porches, with square balusters and Tuscan columns on brick piers, shelter the side-entry opening and only one half of the paired window openings. The row houses in the 1900 block of East 31<sup>st</sup> Street are notably parallel to those on East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street, with the exception of the roof. Pierced by a shed-roofed dormer with paired double-hung sash, the roof over each unit is pitched, forming a half gable or extended false mansard. The individual cornices of zinc extend nearly the full width of the facades, presenting an ogee-molded architrave, bed molding, and cornice over a narrow frieze. The porches of these row houses are veneered in stone with brick posts, complete with plinth and capital, supporting the flat roofs.

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Inspired by the Colonial Revival style are the end units of rows fronting the 1900 and 2000 blocks of East 32<sup>nd</sup> Street. (Photo #20) Acting as anchors to the row houses and the neighborhood itself, the three examples are located at 1939, 2001, and 2045 East 32<sup>nd</sup> Street. Each unit rises two-and-a-half stories in height on a raised foundation with a front-gabled roof of asphalt shingles and wrap-around porch. They are two bays wide and three bays deep, which is the same as the attached two-story row houses. The house at 2045 East 32<sup>nd</sup> Street has a wraparound porch with solid brick balustrades and brick piers topped by Tuscan columns; the porch has been enclosed with windows and fanlights. The ogee-molded cornice overhangs the bed molding and a narrow plain frieze with ogee architrave. The pedimented entry is located in the end bay, beyond the porch. The shallow fanlight is set over the single-leaf entry, which is finished with multi-light sidelights. The enclosed tympanum of the pedimented surround has an ogee profile with frieze. The window openings piercing the Flemish-bond brick exterior are single and paired, holding 6/6 and 8/8 sash with rowlock brick sills and gauges arches composed of three brick courses. A wide single double-hung window with replacement sash is located in the upper gable end of the façade. The opening, set on a rowlock brick sill, is frame on three sides with rowlock bricks. A rowlock string course, interrupted by the opening's sill, marks the transition from the Flemish-bond brickwork to a herringbone brick pattern. The open gable end has short cornice returns, ogee-molded bed molding and cornice, and raking. An exterior chimney of brick with string coursing at the top protrudes from the east side elevation, breaking the cornice line. Hipped dormers with asphalt shingles on the cheeks, project from the eastern slope of the roof. An oriel window, the ghosting of which remains, was located next to the chimney, directly below the dormers. The opening of the oriel has been infilled with synthetic siding and a single double-hung window inserted.

Corner stores were often incorporated into the first stories of the row houses on East 28<sup>th</sup>, 29<sup>th</sup>, and 30<sup>th</sup> Streets. (Photo # 14) The example at 1801 East 29<sup>th</sup> Street has a three-bay-wide façade with a two-bay-wide corner storefront demarcating its use. Wrapping the corner, the storefront is composed of a bay window and single-leaf entry. The now-boxed bay window has been altered by the addition of a concrete block base, metal security bars over the window openings, and enclosure of the transoms. The entry now holds a metal-frame glass commercial-style door with metal security door. The transom has also been enclosed. The overhanging entablature, stylistically inspired by the Italianate style, has ogee-molded architrave, bed molding, and cornice with narrow frieze marked by a dentil course and scrolled brackets. Similar corner entries are found at 1633 East 30<sup>th</sup> Street and 1650 Chilton Avenue. The corner store in the apartment building at 1901 East 30<sup>th</sup> Street has three-light show windows with multi-light fixed transoms. The wrapping cornice has modillions on the overhanging soffit.

Purpose-built commercial buildings, with residential space on the upper story, were erected along Hillen Road. Reflecting the massing, materials, and architectural influences of the row houses, the four commercial buildings at 2831-2837 Hillen Road stand two stories in height, sitting directly on the street. (Photo #9) Covered by false Mansard roofs of square-butt slate shingles with narrow boxed cornices and brick firewalls, the buildings are constructed of pressed brick laid in all-stretcher bond on the facades. Marked by brick quoins, the side elevations are brick laid in five-course American bond. The two end buildings are two bays wide, with paired

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openings placed in the outer bays of the second story. The two center buildings are three bays wide, each with three single openings on the second story. The first stories of each building have been altered, allowing for individuality and changing commercial needs. Historically single-leaf openings, with fixed transoms, pierced the end bays of each building; one opening provides access to the commercial space and the other opening leads to an enclosed stair to the residential space on the second story. The division of commercial and residential is visually provided by the pent roof that stretches the full width of the façade, uniting each of the four buildings as one row. The square-butt slate shingle roof has front gables set directly over the residential entry openings. The gables have half-timbering with raking cornices. Knee brackets, grouped in pairs, support the pent roof. The pent roof has been removed from the end buildings at 2831 and 2837 Hillen Road, although ghosting remains in the brickwork. A shed roof with light-box has been added to 2837 Hillen Road. Changes to the commercial storefronts include enlarging window openings and enclosing of one residential entry opening.

The five churches that now serve the historic district were not initially planned to be a part of the neighborhood. (Photo #4) Yet the development pattern by which the area grew allowed for the siting of imposing religious structures on corner lots along Hillen Road and The Alameda. The churches reflect a commonality of design; all are brick structures with rough-faced cut stone and concrete detailing veneering the primary elevations. Front-gabled roofs of asphalt shingles rise multiple stories over the naves. Several have corner towers or projecting bays that house the entry vestibules. The buildings have lancet arched openings. The primary entries are double-leaf with multi-light transoms set in molded wood surrounds. The window openings, topped by gauged stone arches like the entry openings, have stained glass with chamfered stone sills. The corner tower of the First United Presbyterian Church (now Greater Faith Hope Tabernacle; United Holy Church of America) at 1900 East 30<sup>th</sup> Street, although fronting Hillen Road, has diagonal buttresses with coping and blind arrow slit openings suggestive of a medieval castle. The square tower is crowned by a flat roof with stepped parapet with concrete coping, blind arrow slits, square-edged concrete string course, and lancet-arched openings with Gothic Revival-styled louvers set on concrete sills. Directly across the street at 3000 Hillen Road is the Third Evangelical Lutheran Church, which is now the William S. Barnes Sr. Memorial Apostolic Faith Church. (Photo # 12) Constructed in 1929, this stone-veneered building has a lancet-arched entry at the center of the facade. The concrete-surrounded entry is crowned by a two-story lancet-arched window of stained glass. Buttresses with pointed caps of concrete frame the center bay, while another set of diagonal buttresses anchor the building at the corners. The front-gabled roof is largely obscured by the pedimented parapet, which is crowned by an antefix.

Although not original to the historic district, automobile garages have been constructed throughout the neighborhood. The grid-like layout of the area, with narrow alleys bisecting the blocks, allowed for the inconspicuous addition of this necessary structure at the rear of many of the narrow lots. Those located behind corner buildings, with street frontage along Tivoly and Fenwick avenues for example, front directly on the primary streets rather than the alleys. These garages are slightly more ornate with concrete balls set atop molded plinths. Generally, the garages are one story in height with a flat roof of a composite material edged by low parapet walls capped by concrete coping. The parapets on the primary elevations are typically stepped. The structures of the garages are concrete, the majority constructed of rock-faced concrete blocks

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that were popular from 1900 to the early 1930s. The examples fronting the primary street rather than the alleys house two automobile, entered through vehicular doors that originally would swing outward; most have replacement door that roll up or openings now covered in plywood. Rock-faced concrete block and brick garages fronting the alleys are either freestanding, located at the end of the lots, or extend the full width of the lot and are an addition to the main block, thus providing additional living space.

#### **Integrity**

The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District has excellent integrity as a cohesive residential neighborhood platted and improved from 1908 to the late 1930s by multiple developers, although Dr. Theodore Cooke and the Frank Novak Realty Company were responsible for most of the development. The integrity of location and setting are sufficiently intact, recounting the subdivision of large summer estates into a suburban neighborhood following the annexation of this portion of Baltimore County as part of Baltimore City in 1888. Further, the development reflects suburban growth brought on by the 1894 electrification of the streetcar, which traveled along Harford Road. The streetcar, which discontinued service in 1956, has been replaced by city-sponsored bus service and private automobiles. The historic district continues to be bounded by major thoroughfares such as Harford Road, East 32<sup>nd</sup> and 33<sup>rd</sup> Streets, and The Alameda, which provide easy and direct access to the area as the streetcar once did. Laid out in an urban grid pattern like the growing city of which it was now part, the neighborhood was located in an undeveloped setting that allowed for amenities typical of suburban living such as the latest technological improvements, full-width porches, front yards, and access to rear yards. These are features that continue to define the historic district today. Although limited, commercial buildings and religious edifices became part of the neighborhood soon after its initial development, making it largely self sufficient; schools and social buildings were and continue to be located on the peripheral. The design, workmanship, and materials that define the historic district are sufficiently intact to reflect the visions of its primary and secondary developers, as well as the residents. With a single exception, all of the residential buildings are attached row houses that characterize the Artistic or Daylight periods of row house development in Baltimore. The historic district is defined by its intact rows of houses, which despite the dates of construction present many similar features such as front and rear porches, molded zinc and brick cornices or parapets, side-entry openings, rear ells, raised basements, and double-hung window openings, many with transoms. Demolition of entire structures has occurred minimally and has been relegated primarily to only corner or end buildings rather than interior buildings. A block of houses between 2731 and 2749 Tivoly Avenue is the only example of a section of a once-intact row having been razed. Stylistically, the eclectic buildings are adorned with elements typical of the Classical Revival, Colonial Revival, and Italianate styles. The revival styles were favored in the city, utilized by the nationally acclaimed architectural firm of McKim, Mead & White and exhibited widely at the 1893 Chicago World's Fair. The Italianate style was the preferred style for row houses in the late nineteenth century and therefore was a commonly recognized architectural expression, especially in Baltimore. The applied ornamentation that provides these architectural expressions has overwhelmingly remained intact, with only a limited number of buildings altered by the removal or encapsulation of stylized features. Porches are a character-defining feature that has remained consistently intact. Porch

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elements such as supports and balusters have been altered as maintenance requires; a few porches have been enclosed but the original supports tend to remain extant and read as such, thus this is often a reversible alteration. The enclosed porch is also an original feature of several rows of buildings, and thus is not uncommon to the neighborhood. A few porches have been replaced by structural awnings over full-width stoops, but are compatible due to their massing and foundations. Weatherboard siding, which clad the rear elevations of some buildings and the oriel windows, has commonly been replaced with synthetic siding or asphalt shingles. This is a typical maintenance alteration; synthetic siding such as vinyl and form stone has been applied to the masonry portions of only a very few buildings that have been deemed non-contributing. Similarly, windows and doors have been replaced, sometimes resulting in the removal of a fixed transom. This is not an overwhelmingly common alteration and is deemed reversible. Moreover, fenestration patterns, opening size, sash types, number of lights, lintels/arches, and sills remain consistently intact in design and material. A few of the corner buildings originally designated as commercial and residential have been rehabilitated to serve solely as residential. This has occurred primarily on the interior of the neighborhood. The placement of the entry opening in the canted corner bay continues to document the buildings' historic use. Because of the continued cohesiveness of the neighborhood plan undertaken originally by the multiple developers, preservation of the massing, architectural expressions, and materials utilized in the construction of the row houses, and the self sufficiency of the area, the historic district retains integrity of feeling and association, representing early-twentieth-century suburbanization as the result of the annexation of the city and electrification of the streetcar.

The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District is a cohesive residential neighborhood composed of fashionable brick row houses dating from the first half of the twentieth century. Capitalizing on the electrification of the streetcar following the annexation of the area from Baltimore County, numerous developers, among them Frank Novak and Dr. Theodore Cooke, platted the area and oversaw construction of continuous rows of two-story single-family dwellings that epitomized suburban middle-class living with stylistic embellishments and materials, modern amenities, open front porches, and green lawns. The neighborhood illustrates the transition in row house design in Baltimore City from long and narrow structures of the Artistic period dressed in the Italianate style, to short and wide buildings of the Classical and Colonial Revival styles from the Daylight period. The realty companies exploited the neighborhood's proximity to Clifton Park, Lake Montebello, and Baltimore City College, promoting the area's rural characteristics and open spaces; all of which remain beneficial to the residents. Wide boulevards with landscaped medians, tree-lined streets, alleys with garages, stone-veneered churches reflecting the Late Gothic Revival style, and corner stores anchored within the uniform rows of houses add to the community's strong sense of place. The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District meets Criterion A because of its role in the suburbanization of Northeast Baltimore and its association with middle-class Baltimoreans

seeking the suburban ideal. The historic district also meets Criterion C as a cohesive residential neighborhood that illustrates the characteristics of early-twentieth-century row house design in form, materials, and design. The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District reflects a period of significance from 1908, when the first section was platted, to 1937, when the last of the row houses were constructed.

# 1780-1850, Establishment of Country Estates in Northeast Baltimore

The rapid growth and expansion of Baltimore City in the late eighteenth century led to the creation of an elite merchant class. In keeping with social and cultural expectations, the wealthy merchants acquired large tracts of land on the periphery of the city's boundaries and established picturesque summer estates.<sup>1</sup> These dwellings allowed them to escape the sweltering heat of the urban environment, but remain close to their respective financial endeavors.

In the early nineteenth century, five major estates were sited along Harford Road directly north of the city's boundary. Harford Road, improved by the Baltimore and Harford Turnpike Company in 1816, further opened the area's rural ambiance to the urban elite.<sup>2</sup> William Wirt eloquently described the region's landscape in 1822:

For while I had been looking on town, bay, and fort, the sun had risen and was now so high that its light was pouring full upon hill and valley, field and forest, blazing in bright reflection from all the eastern windows of the hundreds of country houses that crowned the heights around me.... The sites of the houses are well selected – always upon some eminence, embosomed amid beautiful trees, from which their white fronts peep out enchantingly.<sup>3</sup>

The Coldstream Homestead Montebello neighborhood, where the historic district is located, was named for the three summer estates that dominated the landscape. Located on the neighborhood's southern extent, Coldstream was the estate of William Patterson. Patterson, an Irish immigrant and hero of the Revolutionary War, provided arms and weapons to the American revolutionaries. At the conclusion of the war, he established his residency in Baltimore and continued mercantile activities, later serving as the first president of the Bank of Maryland and one of the incorporators of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad.<sup>4</sup> Thomas Gorsuch, a prosperous plantation owner, established the Homestead estate in the 1700s. The Gorsuch family, who had a

Name of Property County and State major role in the public affairs of Baltimore County since its early history, resided on the estate until Robert Gorsuch Jr. subdivided the ancestral land in 1850.<sup>5</sup>

The historic district is located in the northeast section of the Coldstream Homestead Montebello neighborhood and is set within part of the former boundaries of the Montebello estate. Established by General Samuel Smith in the late 1790s, Montebello's high-style mansion with Adamesque and classical architectural details expressed the financial success of the owner.<sup>6</sup> Setback from Harford Road via a winding drive and flat lawns, the estate read as a villa with the outbuildings, slave quarters, stables, barns, smokehouse, and icehouse located out of sight.<sup>7</sup> Smith was born in 1752 to a wealthy merchant family and received his early education in Baltimore. In the 1770s, he worked as a clerk in England and traveled throughout Europe establishing trade agreements for his father's company. During the American Revolution, he enlisted as a Captain and became known as the "Hero of Mud Island" for his valiant efforts at the Battle of Long Island.<sup>8</sup> After the war, Smith engaged in numerous successful financial ventures including incorporating the Bank of Maryland, quickly becoming the wealthiest merchant in Baltimore City.<sup>9</sup> He briefly served as mayor of Baltimore prior to his death in 1839.<sup>10</sup>

Thomas Kelso, an Irish immigrant, purchased a portion of the former Montebello estate circa 1840 and established Pleasant View, a forty-acre estate opposite the country seat of John Hopkins.<sup>11</sup> The 1850 *Map of the City and County of Baltimore, Maryland* and 1853 *Plan of Baltimore and Vicinity* document Kelso's property and dwelling located between Harford and Hillen Roads. Kelso, a successful Baltimore merchant, was the director of the Philadelphia, Wilmington, and Baltimore Railroad for thirty-seven years.<sup>12</sup> He established the Kelso Home for Orphan Children of the Methodist Episcopal Church with an endowment of \$120,000.<sup>13</sup> Kelso died in 1878 at 94 years of age; he had accumulated \$400,000 at the time of his death – equal to

Name of Property \$9.4 million today. According to his will, the main dwelling at Pleasant View was to be devised to his daughter, the wife of Reverend Guiteau, who resided at the estate.<sup>14</sup>

# 1850-1894, Early Suburban Efforts in Coldstream Homestead Montebello

Similar to wealthy merchants, Baltimore City middle-class residents desired open pastoral landscapes away from the urban environment. Capitalizing on the economic and social climate, Robert Gorsuch Jr. formed a syndicate to subdivide the Homestead estate in 1850 to create Homestead Village. He recognized the middle-class's aspiration to associate themselves with the grand county estates of Baltimore's prominent class. Advertisements promoted the location's rural characteristics, open spaces, ambiance, and prestige.<sup>15</sup> Particularly, since Gorsuch and his syndicate laid the village out in an urban grid-like pattern, which was the most profitable means to develop and sell land for residential use.

Homestead Village struggled to grow due to poor financial planning and a lack of reliable transportation to Baltimore City.<sup>16</sup> An omnibus (urban stage coach) offered access to the neighborhood, albeit limited.<sup>17</sup> In 1870, the Baltimore and the Halls Spring Passenger Railway was incorporated and constructed a horse-car line "from the City Hall and North street, via Fayette, Aisquith and Madison streets and Central avenue to Harford road, where connection was made with another car for Homestead and Halls Springs."<sup>18</sup> The continued development of the horse-drawn streetcar coupled with affordable housing increased the desirability of the village. Yet, Homestead remained the only suburban community laid out in northeast Baltimore in the nineteenth century.<sup>19</sup>

## 1850-1894, Montebello and Pleasant View

The area that is now the Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District continued to be dominated by large country estates. Montebello and Pleasant View comprised the sections west and east of Hillen Road, respectively.<sup>20</sup> After Colonel Samuel Smith's death, John Spear Smith, his son, sold Montebello to William Tiffany in 1842.<sup>21</sup> William George Tiffany, a lawyer, sold the property to John Work Garrett in 1871 for \$50,000.<sup>22</sup> The *Baltimore Sun* stated:

The property purchased occupies one of the highest points, and possess one of the most beautiful inland and water views in Baltimore County.... The improvements

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of the Hillen road of the newly laid out Arlington avenue, on which the estate boards, opposite the lands of A.S. Abell, Enoch Pratt, William T. Walters and William P. Patterson, Esqs., and the building of the proposed road from Baltimore to Towsontown [as it was originally known], passing in the rear of these lands, will make the property one of the most valuable in the State of Maryland. In beauty and healthfulness of location it is unsurpassed by any other country seat in the country.<sup>23</sup>

Garrett was born in Baltimore in 1820. At a young age, he amassed a substantial fortune expanding his father's banking business and acquiring large amounts of stock in the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad. In 1858, he became the president of the railroad company. Other financial ventures include establishing the Baltimore and Ohio Telegraph Line and the laying of the Atlantic telegraph cable.<sup>24</sup>

Although Garrett acquired Montebello, he did not reside at Colonel Smith's mansion. Garrett owned the Archibald String estate adjoining Montebello to the north. According to historian Eric Holcomb, "His son, Thomas Harrison, used the estate until Evergreen off of York Road was completed."<sup>25</sup> After Garrett's death, the property was acquired by Mary Garrett, who lived on the massive estate into the twentieth century.<sup>26</sup>

The 1875 *City Atlas of Baltimore Maryland and Environs* documents Thomas Kelso's Pleasant View estate to the east of Montebello across Hillen Road.<sup>27</sup> At the intersection of Hillen and Harford Roads, however, was Saint Bernard's Church, "B.S. Sh.," and an additional dwelling.<sup>28</sup> After Kelso's death in 1878, Bromley's 1889 *Plats of the Twenty First and Twenty Second Wards of Baltimore City* records the division of the estate by Kelso's heirs.<sup>29</sup> The largest lot containing the mansion was owned by Dr. Theodore Cooke and Sarah B. Cooke, nee Guiteau. Other heirs owned smaller lots facing Harford Road and constructed a mixture of wood-frame and brick dwellings circa 1880. The increasing development of Homestead Village and the success of the streetcar led to the construction of these freestanding dwellings, the first instance of a large summer estate's division into suburban lots within the Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District. The majority of the circa 1880 dwellings were demolished in the second-half of the twentieth century; none remain standing today.

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## 1894-1926, Electrification of Streetcar and Development

Baltimore City's 1888 annexation of the surrounding western and northern sections of Baltimore County increased the properties' value as the city became responsible for improvements to the local infrastructure. Additionally, the tax structure for annexed land spurred investment and development.<sup>30</sup> Coupled with City Passenger Railway's purchase of the Halls Spring Passenger Railway in 1885 and its electrification in 1894, housing developed at a rapid pace in the first quarter of the twentieth century.<sup>31</sup> All the subdivisions in Baltimore were directly tied to the streetcar lines, which expanded the radius an individual could live from his/her workplace. The neighborhood's desirability was further increased in 1901 when the city purchased Clifton Park, located directly east of the Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District.<sup>32</sup>

These improvements contributed to the construction of the only remaining nineteenth-century dwelling in the historic district. In 1898, John and Katherine Friedel purchased a lot formerly owned by Harrison and Jane Adreon, heirs of Thomas Kelso.<sup>33</sup> An 1894 *City of Baltimore Topographical Survey* recorded no improvements on the lot.<sup>34</sup> The 1899 *City Directory* listed the Friedels living at 626 Ensor Street.<sup>35</sup> The following year, the Friedels and their five children moved to 2926 Harford Road, then numbered 432 Harford Road, indicating the dwelling's construction date.<sup>36</sup> A 1910 *Baltimore Sun* classified advertisement stated, "Large Three-Story Brick Building, suitable for Hotel, Apartment House, or Sanatorium; beautiful location; 432 Harford road, opposite Clifton Park; Lot and Dwelling 100x214."<sup>37</sup> In the 1920s and 1930s, renowned Baltimore poet Lizette Woodworth Reese lived in the dwelling, the only freestanding single-family dwelling extant in the historic district.<sup>38</sup>

## Development of the Northeast Baltimore District

Northeast Baltimore contained only 279 dwellings in 1898. Forty years later, 14,343 residential buildings were standing.<sup>39</sup> The region's rural attributes, improved technology including water and electricity, and inexpensive housing further enticed Baltimoreans to the newly laid suburban neighborhoods. In proximity to the Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District,

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Baltimore City improved the roads, purchasing and widening Harford Road, and constructing The Alameda in 1914. The Alameda connected 33<sup>rd</sup> Street and Harford Road/Clifton Park. In conjunction with similar boulevards or parkways, the design of The Alameda followed the recommendations of the 1904 Olmsted firm's Comprehensive Report, functioning as an extension of the physical park itself. The road with a wide landscaped median directly connected the neighborhood to the pastoral setting.<sup>40</sup> Clifton Park, a 273-acre park with various recreational and social activities, including the construction of an eighteen-hole golf course in 1916, became extremely popular.<sup>41</sup> In 1928, the Baltimore City College was sited at 3220 The Alameda, directly opposite the Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District. The Gothic Revival-style school and grounds cost over \$3,000,000 to build and was the most expensive undertaking by the Baltimore school system to date.<sup>42</sup> The school added to the abundant green space with its landscaped campus within immediate proximity to the neighborhood and was an architectural icon. Such amenities made the historic district a very desirable location.

The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District was created/designed by multiple developers. Dr. Theodore Cooke constructed the eastern portion of the district, bound by Hillen Road to the west, Harford Road to the south and east, and East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to the north. Frank Novak Realty Company constructed the western section of the district, bound by The Alameda and Kirk Avenue to the west, 29<sup>th</sup> Street to the south, Hillen Road to the east, and 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to the north. Rochester-Kirkness Realty Company, Joseph H. White Realty, and Broring Building Company developed the southwestern section. Although the construction of the entire historic district spanned a fifteen-year period, the developers all built brick row houses.

In the nineteenth century, brick row houses were the architectural icon of Baltimore City and the symbol of urbanity, housing all economic classes of Baltimoreans.<sup>43</sup> In the first-quarter of the twentieth century, Baltimore's population continued to grow at rapid rates necessitating the continual construction of dwellings; however, middle-class residents' desire for row houses with urban setbacks lessened due to the prevalence of the suburban ideal of owning a detached or freestanding dwelling.<sup>44</sup> As a result, developers started to incorporate suburban aspects into urban row houses, such as porches, front and rear lawns, and abundance of natural light. Capitalizing on large economies of scale, mass production, and improved building technology, developers were able to sell row houses at affordable prices while offering an urban dwelling in a suburban environment.<sup>45</sup>

The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District features two periods of urban row houses generally divided by World War I. As described in Mary Ellen Hayward and Charles

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Belfoure's *The Baltimore Rowhouse*, the historic district's dwellings represent the porch-front rows of the Artistic period (1875-1915) and daylight rows of the Daylight period (1915-1955).

Artistic Period Row houses: Hayward and Belfoure contended that the Artistic period row house applied the eclectic styles of the late nineteenth century to two- and three-story row houses. Classical row houses of the Artistic period emerged in the 1890s. The buildings featured a flatfacade, brown brick and white marble trim, classical cornices and details.<sup>46</sup> In order to compete with freestanding single-family dwellings and pervading suburban culture, developers altered the design circa 1905 to include an open porch with classical columns and a small lawn. These row houses, labeled "Philadelphia porch-front houses," retained the massing of the older Baltimore row house. In a number of examples, however, long exterior halls were punched inward from the rear facade that permitted light into the middle of the dwelling. Other features include a secondstory oriel or bay window ornamented with classical detailing such as swags and corner columns. Between 1910 and 1915, the majority of the porch-front row houses in Baltimore was two-stories and built for the working class. Developers simply pared down high-style three-story dwellings by omitting more expensive architectural details, such as Dutch gables and tiled roofs.<sup>47</sup> The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District features such simplified, two-story, row house designs on the 2800, 2900, and 3000 blocks of Harford Road, the 2700 blocks of Tivoly, Fenwick, and Hugo Avenues, and 1915-2045 East 31<sup>st</sup> Street. These areas were developed first due to their proximity to the streetcar and Harford Road, a major thoroughfare.

Daylight Period Row houses: The Daylight period row houses started to appear circa 1913. The two-room wide, two-room deep, floor plans allowed light into every room; instead of long and narrow (16') buildings, developers constructed short and wide (20') row houses. The buildings had the latest technological improvements, full-width, deep front porches, and front yards, thereby offering the amenities of suburban living. Developers stated, "These houses are something different; they carry that air of beauty and refinement that becomes the high-price homes of Guilford and Roland Park."<sup>48</sup> Car garages or room to construct garages were located along the alley. Daylight row houses dominate Frank Novak Realty Company's western section of the district, bound by The Alameda to the west, 29<sup>th</sup> Street to the south, Hillen Road to the east, and 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to the north.

# 1909-1926, Development of Cooke's East Section and the Southwest Section

Dr. Theodore Cooke (1838-1918) was the son of Israel and Arietta Cooke and was born in Baltimore County. He attended Baltimore public schools prior to attending Greenlane Academy, Baltimore County. Cooke studied medicine at the University of Maryland and opened a practice in Baltimore City, becoming one of the most respected doctors in the city. In addition, he became one of the largest developers in Baltimore, improving properties near Riverside Park, Maryland Road, North Avenue and Fulton Road, and Lanvale and Lafayette avenues.<sup>49</sup> Cooke married

Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District (B-5145) Name of Property Sarah B. Guiteau, the daughter of Reverend Sheridan Guiteau, who was heir to the Thomas Kelso estate.<sup>50</sup>

With this land, Dr. Theodore Cooke developed the Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District east of Hillen Road. A 1908 plat map illustrates the proposed streets and articles in the *Baltimore Sun* state that Cooke started planning the construction of the brick row houses in 1909. Three separate articles listed Jerome Love, Jacob F. Gerwig, and Herbert W. Cooke as architects for the development.<sup>51</sup> By 1915, Artistic period row houses lined East 31<sup>st</sup> Street and Harford Road. The remaining rows east of Hillen Road are of the Daylight period and were constructed after World War I.

The Rochester-Kirkness Realty and Joseph L. White Realty constructed Artistic period row houses in the southwestern section of the district. The Rochester-Kirkness Realty Company developed the 2800 block of Harford Road. Both realty companies constructed row houses on Fenwick and Tivoly Avenues, south of East 28<sup>th</sup> Street. In 1913 and 1914, advertisements for the properties ran in the *Baltimore Sun*. One such advertisement stated:

You don't have to be wealthy to own one of these handsome little palaces on Harford Road (2800 Block) Opposite Beautiful Clifton Park. Absolutely the finest built two-story homes in Baltimore.... They have porch fronts, seven rooms, bath, reception hall. Hot water heat, fancy gas ranges and gas logs, showered light throughout. Only 15 minutes to Centre of City.<sup>52</sup>

The United States Census depicts a middle-class white neighborhood with a few immigrants, mostly of German and English descent.<sup>53</sup> The residents were employed in professions such as lawyers, engineers, store managers, bank managers, clerks, book keepers, nurses, secretaries, foremen, and carpenters.<sup>54</sup> The majority of the dwellings were owner-occupied, although there were a number of renters.<sup>55</sup> In 1915, the neighborhood was separated from Homestead by the not yet developed The Alameda and the Mary Garrett estate. As a result, four corner stores were located within the Cooke, Rochester-Kirkness, and White Realty development districts, two to the east and west of Hillen Road.<sup>56</sup> On the west side of Hillen Road, a 1914 classified advertisement for 2700 Tivoly Avenue in the *Baltimore Sun* stated, "FINE BUSINESS

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OPPORTUNIY for right man; store and dwelling for sale, with stock and fixtures; in new locality."<sup>57</sup> H. Freyer opened a grocery store at the location.<sup>58</sup> On the east side of Hillen Road, Charles Lidard operated a grocery store at 2045 East 31<sup>st</sup> Street. Thereby, all the residents had basic amenities within a short distance from their dwelling. Yet, no religious institutions were located within the district. In all likelihood, early residents traveled to nearby Homestead for such services.

Dr. Theodore Cooke was killed in a car accident in 1918. Cooke's son, Herbert Webster Cooke, took control of the realty company and finished improving the remaining lots east of Hillen Road. In order to accommodate the growing automobile culture, a forty-car garage was built near the corner of Jenifer and East 29<sup>th</sup> streets to accommodate the owners of the Artistic period row houses that lacked garages. The subsequent 1919 infill of Cooke's land featured Daylight row houses. In addition, Herbert built four three-story brick apartment buildings: three along Hillen Road and one at the intersection of East 30<sup>th</sup> Street and Jenifer Avenue.<sup>59</sup> Other improvements included the construction of First United Presbyterian Church at the northeast corner of Hillen Road and East 30<sup>th</sup> Street.<sup>60</sup>

Charles Boring Realty Company improved the remaining lots in the southwestern section of the district located north of the Rochester-Kirkness Realty and Joseph L. White Realty developments and south of East 29<sup>th</sup> Street. Boring Realty's dwellings, constructed circa 1920-1924, continued the massing and flat façade of the Artistic period, but retained the open front porches that unify the district. The new development added multiple businesses.<sup>61</sup>

# 1919-1926, Development of Frank Novak's Section of Coldstream Homestead Montebello

Frank Novak, the son of Czech emigrants, was born in East Baltimore in 1877. At the age of thirteen, he quit school to become the apprentice of a carpenter. After his employer died, Novak finished the uncompleted projects and then proceeded to open the Frank Novak Realty Company. Constructing almost 10,000 houses within Baltimore, he became independently wealthy and locally famous.<sup>62</sup> Novak died in 1945, his obituary in the *Baltimore Sun* stated:

At the height of his career he was called "The Two-Story King of East Baltimore," because of the two-story, brick row, porch front model in which he specialized. Whole neighborhoods of such construction mark his developments and give much of the character to sections of East and Northeast Baltimore.<sup>63</sup>

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The *Baltimore Sun* reported that Frank Novak paid \$250,000 for 120 acres of the former Montebello estate. Mary Garrett, who died in 1915, left the tract to Dr. Mary Carey Thomas, president of Bryn Mawr College. Novak planned to erect 2,000 dwellings at a cost of \$9,000,000. The article states:

Mr. Novak, in making the announcement, said yesterday that the work of grading the streets would begin just so soon as the machinery for that purpose could be gathered together and put in operation. The dwellings will be of the two-story brick variety, but differing from those previously erected by the company in that they will be of the "daylight" kind, in contradiction to what is known as the "box" house.... This, said Mr. Novak, is in line with the recommendations of the city planners and the most advanced thought in building the country over.

Frank Novak Realty Company's western section of the district, constructed between 1920 and 1925, was bound by The Alameda to the west, 29<sup>th</sup> Street to the south, Hillen Road to the east, and East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to the north.<sup>64</sup> Charles Boring Realty, however, constructed the majority of the row houses on East 30<sup>th</sup> Street; the dwellings were not of the Daylight style.<sup>65</sup>

Similar to Cooke's development, Novak's development was occupied by middle-class white Baltimoreans creating a homogeneous community. The 1930 United States Census recorded the average dwelling was valued at approximately \$6,500 to \$7,500.<sup>66</sup> Three churches were built within Novak's section, including St. Thomas Episcopal Church and Alameda Baptist Church located on the east side of The Alameda, and Third Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Ascension located on the west side of Hillen Road.<sup>67</sup> The historic district contained churches of varying denominations, offering residents a variety of places of worship. In addition, the area contained seven corner stores. For example, 1633 East 30<sup>th</sup> Street contained Frank's Paint and Hardware and 1730 Chilton Avenue had a grocery.<sup>68</sup> The neighborhood had all the amenities and services a middle-class family sought.

# 1937, Montebello Building Association Development

The final set of row houses constructed within the Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District is located between 2015 and 2021 East 30<sup>th</sup> Street. Constructed in 1937, the buildings are within Cooke's development.<sup>69</sup> Montebello Building Association acquired the large lot and razed

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a circa 1900 wood-framed dwelling described as a "Cottage apartment, six rooms and bath."<sup>70</sup> The developer's four row houses lack the architectural details of the surrounding dwellings due to a poor economic climate and high cost of building materials brought on by the Great Depression. A 1940s advertisement for one of the row houses stated, "Close to Harford Rd. & Clifton Pk. [park] 6 cool rms [rooms], modern tile bath, hdwd. flrs [hardwood floors]." The four dwellings all have front porches, pedimented parapets, and small lawns matching the established building forms in the neighborhood, especially along this block. In addition, the building at 2015 East 30<sup>th</sup> Street adjoins 2013 East 30<sup>th</sup> Street, seamlessly continuing the existing row.

# 1940-Present Day, Coldstream Homestead Montebello Changing Demographics

The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District continued to be a middle-class white neighborhood in the 1930s and 1940s. Streetcars served Harford Road until June 19, 1956, when they were replaced by buses. The automobile culture further removed commercial interests from the district as residents traveled to strip malls for shopping. Although the urban row houses were built with suburban principles, the district's proximity to Baltimore City center, its architecture, and the development of new suburbs led to the district's complete urbanization by the 1960s.

In the 1950s and 1960s, African-American Baltimoreans faced a scarce supply of housing due to the results of urban renewal, highway construction projects, and racism. Urban renewal efforts displaced more than seventy-five thousand people. Coupled with new developments reserved only for Caucasians, dishonest real estate brokers engaged in blockbusting. The real estate developers stirred fear in white neighborhoods by claiming real estate prices were about to plummet due to changing demographics. As a result, the realtors were able to purchase the houses at low prices. They then sold the dwellings to African Americans willing to pay higher prices since they had very limited options for home ownership.<sup>71</sup> These predatory practices accelerated the middle and upper class flight from Coldstream Homestead Montebello. The developers who benefited from such tactics often stepped away from the community, having made minimal investments towards its improvement. Businesses were further impacted by the 1968 riots and the lack of subsequent investment by the city. Subsidized housing programs in the 1980s increased the number of rental units and low-end investors.<sup>72</sup> The community's demographics have been maintained since the transition from a predominantly white neighborhood to an African-American neighborhood. Despite these issues, Coldstream Homestead Montebello has an active community corporation and a dedicated core of residents, many of whom have lived within the district for over thirty years.

Verbal Boundary Description (Describe the boundaries of the property.)

The Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District is a residential neighborhood located in northeastern Baltimore City, an area that was part of Baltimore County prior to its suburban development. The triangular-shaped community is bounded on the southeast side by Harford Road, a highly traveled route leading directly into downtown Baltimore. The six-lane road divides the neighborhood from Clifton Park and Clifton Park Golf Course, which are located to the southeast. The southwestern boundary is created by those buildings fronting the west side of The Alameda. On this side of The Alameda, those row houses facing Kennedy Avenue, East 28<sup>th</sup> Street, and East 29<sup>th</sup> Street, terminating at and including Kirk Avenue, form the westernmost border, abutting the Homestead Village neighborhood to the southwest and the campus of Baltimore City College to the northwest. The Alameda is divided by medians that provide landscaping with shade trees and flowering plantings. To the north of Kirk Avenue, which runs diagonally, the northwest boundary includes those properties on the east side of The Alameda. East 33rd Street, the northern border, also has landscaped medians with shade trees as it runs between Hillen Road and The Alameda. The smaller Montebello Park, complete with a basketball court, mature trees, and paved walkways, fronts Harford Road, with Jenifer Avenue and East 29<sup>th</sup> Street at its northern corner.

# **Boundary Justification** (Explain why the boundaries were selected.)

The boundaries for the Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District was created and improved by several developers. Dr. Theodore Cooke constructed the eastern portion of the district, bound by Hillen Road to the west, Harford Road to the south and east, and East 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to the north. Frank Novak Realty Company constructed the western section of the district, bound by The Alameda and Kirk Avenue to the west, 29<sup>th</sup> Street to the south, Hillen Road to the east, and 33<sup>rd</sup> Street to the north. Rochester-Kirkness Realty Company, Joseph H. White Realty, and Boring Building Company developed the southwestern section of the historic district. Although the construction of the entire historic district spanned a fifteen-year period, the developers all built brick row houses, which through their architectural expressions, ornamentation, materials, setbacks, and massing present a cohesive neighborhood. The two types of row houses, reflecting housing needs before and after World War I, represent the porch-front rows of the Artistic period (1875-1915) and daylight rows of the Daylight period (1915-1955).

The development of the several platted blocks that make up the Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District has been greatly affected by the framing transportation routes, which are visual and physical boundaries. To the north, 33<sup>rd</sup> Street is a divided road with a landscaped median between four lanes. The south side of 33<sup>rd</sup> Street, which is included in the historic district, was platted by Dr. Theodore Cooke and improved by the construction of row houses. The north side of 33<sup>rd</sup> Street, which is excluded from the historic district, was improved in the period following that of the Coldstream Homestead Montebello Historic District by freestanding and twin single-family dwellings dating from the 1930s and early 1940s.

East 32<sup>nd</sup> Street forms the northern border to the east of Hillen Road. Hillen Triangle, ornamented with an imposing bronze statue of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., unites East 32<sup>nd</sup> and

33<sup>rd</sup> Streets as they follow the natural typography; this park in not included within the historic district. The Montebello School and the filtration plant at Lake Montebello are located to the north of the historic district on East 32<sup>nd</sup> Street, to the east of Hillen Road.

On the east side of the historic district is Harford Road, which is a highly traveled six-lane transportation corridor that traverses the city. To the east of the road, outside the historic district, is Clifton Park Golf Course and Clifton Park. The park and golf course do not have a related context to the historic district.

The Alameda, which like East 32<sup>nd</sup> and 33<sup>rd</sup> streets and Harford Road, is a four-lane divided transportation corridor with a landscaped median. Although physically dividing the neighborhood, the medians visually and socially unite the two areas by serving as parkland. The street is lined on both sides with similarly designed row houses of brick and churches dressed in stone. The subdivisions flanking this street were both platted and improved by the same developers, resulting in row houses of similar design, materials, workmanship, and massing. The boundary extends off The Alameda at Kennedy Avenue to Kirk Avenue, thus including the entire area platted by these developers. The neighborhood to the southwest at Abbotston Street was platted as Homestead Village and was improved by freestanding and row houses of wood frame and brick construction beginning in the late nineteenth century. The neighborhood includes a library, fire house, stores, and churches. The integrity of the buildings in the area to the southwest of and including Abbotston Street has been compromised by alterations, additions, and deterioration of materials. The campus of Baltimore City College, which is set on a significance rise, forms the northwest border and does not have a related historic context to the historic district.
