

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION

The Alfred Griffin House is a one story structure with a masonry core 25 feet deep by 30 feet wide and frame additions to the south and east. The front facade of the house is symmetrical and consists of single, double-hung windows on either side of a paneled door with sidelights. All openings in the brick walls are topped with segmental arches. The roof is pyramidal in form with moderate pitch. A chimney protrudes from the apex of the roof. Triangular ventilator dormers are also featured on the roof. Except for removal of the front porch the building is substantially unchanged.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Built in 1908 by the Chinese Inspector, Alfred Griffin Jr., the house at 641 First Avenue is a well preserved example of the brick residences built in Yuma during the first and second decades of the 20th century. Simple in design, the builders employed well established masonry techniques to produce a substantially sound stucture. The symmetry and low profile of the building may have been derived from Classical Revival styles. In 1921 the property was given to the Protestant Episcopal Church for use as a rectory.
