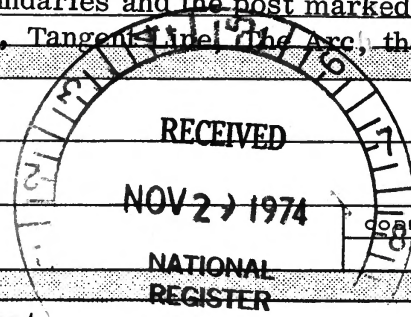

DESCRIBE VIEW, DIRECTION, ETC. View from the south, looking north along the western boundary of Delaware, showing the three stones at the southwest corner of Delaware. The large white stone in the enclosure is the beginning point of the Mason-Dixon survey. The smaller stone to the right is the original middle point marker; a third stone obscured by the others, is called the "Imposter" and its origin is unknown. The enclosure was erected in 1962 to protect the monuments.
