The large white stone in the enclosure is the beginning point of the Mason-Dixon survey. The smaller stone to the right is the original middle point marker; a third stone obscured by the others, is called the "Imposter" and its origin is unknown. The enclosure was erected in 1962 to protect the monuments.

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
