Henry ("Harry") H. Daniel is listed here as early as 1891. That year in the city directory, he is listed as proprietor of a 10th Street grocery and a 1st Avenue saloon. In 1894 he is listed as a grocer; however, by 1896, Daniel is Secretary-Treasure of "Mutal Cotton Oil Co."(a local cotton seed oil mill), and also as a grocer. He is listed for the last time at this address as a grocer in the city directory of 1896-1897. His wife, Mamie is also listed. By 1900, Lewis G. Schuessler and his wife, Lula were living here. Schuessler was a traveling salesman for locally owned and operated "Davis Wagon Co." N.R. AREA(S) OF SIGNIFICANCE: Local History, Architecture LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANCE: Local .SIGNIFICANCE STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL): (Local History): This house is significant as it was the home of Henry H. Daniel, a local grocer and officer in the "Mutual Cotton Oil Co.". Daniel lived here from the early 1890's until the turn of the century. Although this house was probably built in the mid-1840's or early 1850's, the later owners are most likely representative as the type of people who lived here when the dwelling was first constructed. Architecture: This house is architecturally significant as one of the few remaining Greek Revival cottages in the downtown area. It is particularly of note for the moulding (CONT.)
