## FICANCE

The Democrat Building is associated with the post-1900 success of the Davenport Democrat Company. A short time after this building was constructed, the <u>Democrat</u> was purchased by the Lee Nwspaper Syndicate. The <u>Democrat's</u> evolution was typical of the trend towards merger of small, independent firms under larger corporations.

## DESCRIPTION

The <u>Davenport Democrat</u> began as the <u>Democratic Banner</u> in 1848. It was edited along Democratic party views, its success varying with the success of the party. D.N. and J.J. Richardson were the <u>Democrat's</u> successful publishers beginning in the 1860's. The <u>Democrat</u> purchased its competitor, the <u>Gazette</u>, in 1887 and the <u>Evening Leader</u> in 1902. In c. 1915 the Lee Newspaper Syndicate took over the merged <u>Democrat and Leader</u>, ending its reign as a local independent news voice.
