DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Erected in two stages, this brick and frame house is now subdivided into two separate residences. Frame section has original address of 32 Legare Street, retains name of Sword Gates. Redecorated 1849, same year Sword Gates were installed in high brick wall in front of frame portion of house. The tall wrought iron gates are decorated with elaborate scrolls and leafage. Each half has a central cross by points of two vertical spears meeting in center of horizontally placed broadsword. Manufactured by Christopher Werner of Charleston.

In the 1960s the brick and frame house, with detached two-story brick kitchen, walled garden, and gates, was subdivided into four lots under separate ownership, with three different houses. The garden was destroyed. The frame portion, now a rambling three-story structure, underwent many late 19th century additions and alterations, losing its earlyperiod architectural integrity.

The brick wing has retained its architectural integrity. Two and a half stories over high basement, slate-covered hip roof. House is 28 feet (two bays) wide and 64 feet (six bays) long. There are three pedimented dormers along the north (Tradd Street) and one on the west (Legare Street). The brick walls are covered with stucco; cornice is also stucco. Double hung windows, nine over nine light sash. First floor windows have exterior paneled shutters and second story shutters are louvered. Basement story modernized for motel rooms.

High stoop approached by 13 sandstone steps supported on brick and stucco quadrant arch leads to first floor entrance. Door is sheltered by pedimented wooden hood with brackets, probably dating from about 1850.

Door leads into one-bay-wide north-south hall across west end of brick wing that once led into frame portion. Door in east wall, near south side, opens into library, also two bays long. West of these two rooms is large drawing room, three bays long, occupying entire west portion of This room, 25 by 32 feet, has 13 foot ceiling. Its west wall contains two symmetrically-balanced doors, leading to stairhall and library. Both doors are single and eight-paneled but are designed to simulate double leaves. In center of east wall, a projecting fireplace with light-gray marble mantel is flanked by pair of windows. Reveals of window openings extend to floor and are wood paneled. Architrave trim is of wood, reeded, and ornamented with original gold leaf. Walls have wooden wainscoting to the chair rail. Ornamental plaster cornice retains what appears to be original coloring--light blue-gray picked out with gold leaf. Ceiling has large plaster centerpiece of 12 large acanthus leaves radiating from leafy central pendant. Floor is of pine boards about five inches wide interior of this room, virtually unaltered, dates from about 1849-50 second floor has two large rooms; three bedrooms on third floor. REGISTER

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE			

Noted property located in the Historic Charleston District, famed for distinctive Sword Gates of same design as grilles once used in Greek Doric guardhouse at Charleston's historic Broad and Meeting Streets. Also classified as valuable for fine garden and house. Although the property was considered by the National Historic Landmark Committee in recent Colonial Architecture selections, it actually belongs to the early 19th century period. (According to the NHL study, "estimated construction dates have ranged wildly in the past.")

The frame section, which retains the original Legare Street address and the Sword Gates, is now believed to have been built around 1803, possibly by French Huguenots James LaRoche and J. Lardent.

The brick wing was probably added about 1818, acquired by Madame Talvaude, and used as girls school.

British consul George A. Hopley bought and redecorated the house in 1849 and installed the Sword gates.
