
Probably built by Samuel Snow in 1793 when he and his wife Dorothea came to Dublin from Jaffrey and bought 70 acres here from Abel Parker. After they died the house passed to their son Ezra (1785-1849), who lived here until about 1842, when he was committed to a mental hospital in Brattleboro, Vt. and the property was handled by his guardian. In 1853 the farm was bought by Abbott Bowman Burpee (1830-1870) whose family owned it through 4 generations and for over a century (until 1957).

The Burpee's—Abbott, his son-in-law L.W. Harrington (b. 1851), and Lewis H. Burpee (b. 1876)—were successful farmers, known for their apples, eggs, and celery. Burpee's maple syrup was always the earliest in the spring. The same family also owned the neighboring Eveleth (Thoreau) farm for a time.

Present owner (since 1969) is Professor of History at Miami University, Oxford, Ohio.
