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The Newington Gilbert House, built in 1864, is a temple-form Greek Revival house. Greek Revival elements are evident in the corner anta pilasters, a wide entablature, and gable returns suggesting a pediment. The two-story house has a side hall plan. Front facade openings are symmetrically arranged; second floor windows are immediately over first floor openings. Double-sash windows have straight frame lintels; on the attic window is a bracketed shelf window head. A porch extends across the front and partially down one side of the house. Porch columns repeat the squared pilaster form. A portion

of the front porch is screened. The main entrance to the house is a double-door, each with two panels and round-arched windows. The house is quite deep with a recessed side

entry on the south facade.
