Green Brook to its North It originally had a straight gable roof and had a shingled roof and walls with 30" cedar shingles - front and rear were symmetrical with 2 windows on either side of the center door - (2 original windows exist). Interior partitions were of "Pallisado" vertical plank construction with lath and plaster each side (part of this has been exposed) The original mantels were removed, but paneling and mantel from a similar house (Capt. Benj. Laing) which was demolished, has been reinstalled in the Dining Room. Other mantels reflect the changes of taste and rooms have been furnished and treated accordingly.

The original house had no windows along the front or rear at second floor level, and this construction can be seen thru a glass panel. There were probably 2 chambers on second floor with windows only on gable ends.

The 1865 alterations created a Ball Room on the second floor - left basic four rooms on frist floor alone, but added a 3 storey tower in rear, raised the roof with sweeping gambrel treatment, surrounded the structure with porches, 3 dormers and an octagonal turret on top of the porch on West end. Clapboard 6" to weather and vertical batten boarding at 2nd floor covered the cedar shingles and scalloped colored slate the roofing.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

2 The "Drake House" originally constructed in 1746 by Nathaniel Drake. It is one of the few remaining 18th Century dwellings remaining in Plainfield. Most of the original building remains, altho added to in 1865 and embelished with Gothic revival towers and appurtances. Wit shows an interesting and representative development of the simple Colonists farmhouse to the veneered reflections of a successful Victorian Businessman's taste at the outbreak of the Civil War. The towers, sweeping rooflines, bays and applied ornamentation are beautiful in their grotesque way and certainly eye catching.

The Historic significance puts General George Washington at the Drake House on June 26, 1777 as a Command Headquarters Post - During "The Battle of the Short Hills" - an important engagement with the entire Continental Army then stationed at Middlebush, Plainfield, New Providence and Pluckemin, numbering about 7,000 troops - engaging Lord Cornwallis and Lord Howe and about 15,000 men in a running fight, resulting in the withdrawal of the main British Forces from New Jersey.

Nathaniel Drake, his two Sons and Negro Slave participated in the fighting and served with the Contenental Army.
