4. Owner: James Ortiz, 326 Santa Fe, Las Vegas, NM
7. Description: Stuccoed foundation; stucco over wood frame walls; wood shingle roof; small overhangs with bargeboard molding and frieze boards; chamfered gable stick work; 1/1 double-hung windows with wood surrounds and (most) with molding cornices; two single doors with transoms on porch; chamfered and grooved porch posts, cut-out brackets and pendant. Located at the eastern edge of the Sulzbacher and Rosenwald addition discussed earlier with Building #1559.
8. Significance: Built during the 1880's, this is one of the least altered picturesque cottages in Las Vegas. The staggered chamfering and cut-out pendant of the gable stickwork matched similar, though more elaborate, detailing of the porch woodwork. The significance of the two porch doors for the interior plan is unknown. In 1908 George Schmitt, a Santa Fe Railroad motorman and his wife lived here; in 1912 and 1919, another motorman, G.J. Laemmle appears in the city directories.
