

#7 Architectural Description

The Ernest Baxter Fite house is a two-story, brick, family home located at the intersection of the Military Road and Thomas Street in Hamilton, Alabama. After its construction in 1927-28 by Montgomery architect Weatherly Carter for the Fites, a Marion County family, the house was continuously used as a residence until 1968, and used on and off until 1984 (Caroline Fite Mixon, interview, November 29, 1992).

Designed and built on a Colonial plan, the sixteen-room house remained the largest and most elegant in the city for many years. An 1880s frame law office measuring 14'x 36' was the office from which three generations of Fites practiced law. The structure sat on court square in downtown Hamilton until 1960, when, due to new downtown building codes which prevented repairs on such structures, it was moved unchanged to the house site (Fite Family Archives). The former office now sits in a wooded lot on the 9-acre house site. Since its relocation has been used for storage by the family.

The east-facing house is built on an irregular L-shaped plan, approximately 69 by 48 feet, including a portico with monumental, 2-story Doric columns. The foundation is of brick. The brick house contains many large windows with limestone lintels, and three doorways with the same feature. The eaves feature dentils. The hip roof was originally of slate, but now of asphalt shingle. One window at the front of the house was ordered filled in by the owner while the house was being built. A balustrade across the top of the front portico has been removed due to weathering (Caroline Fite Mixon, interview, November 29, 1992).

The house contains a small basement room; first-story rooms including a sun room, bedroom, bathroom, living room, dining room, kitchen, breakfast room, entrance hall, and dividing stairway; and second-story rooms including five bedrooms, a sleeping porch, and two bathrooms. Floors are of oak, the walls and the 10-12' ceilings of plaster. There are four fireplaces, one with a limestone mantel in the living room, the others with brick and wood mantels located in bedrooms. Double arched doorways lead from the largest room in the house, the 28'x 18' living room, into the sun room. A grand staircase at the rear of the entrance hall ascends to a landing where it splits and continues up both sides of the hall. Many large windows light

the house. Wide beveled crown molding decorates the living room, entrance hall, sun room, and dining room. Chandeliers in the living room and dining room were removed by family members when the house ceased to be occupied. A few of the steam radiators were also removed.

The only changes to the house are those cited above. Its roof is less than ten years old, and careful observation has shown the house to be structurally sound.

The Law Office is a white clapboard shotgun structure with a gable roof. Its two rooms, roughly equal in size, each contain a fireplace. The architecture is of a type common in Marion County in the mid-to-late nineteenth century.

Features of the landscape which survive include 2 garden pools, an outdoor fireplace, 4 wells, and the perennial remnants of a flower garden. These features are contemporary to the house, and have remained unchanged except for natural growth. A frame garage which stood behind the house has not survived.

The nine-acre setting of the house remains undisturbed by other development. A wooded lot now surrounds the buildings, as it has from the beginning. This site keeps the house in its proper historic setting, since it was cultivated or kept by the family as garden, yard, or wooded lot.

#8 Statement of Significance

Architectural Significance:

The Ernest B. Fite House, constructed in 1927-1928, is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C. Designed by Montgomery architect Weatherly Carter, the house is one of the finest articulations of the Colonial Revival style in Marion County. It is a prominent landmark in the small community of Hamilton. The house is historically associated with the Fite family. Ernest Baxter Fite and his son Rankin Fite were locally prominent attorneys and also served in the state legislature (History of Marion County, Marion County Teachers, 1959).

The Colonial Revival style in America was popular for residential architecture from 1880 to 1955. However, the style really caught on in the 1890s. The Chicago World's Fair of 1893 introduced colonial inspired architecture to the nation. This architecture was a reaction to the excesses of Victorian design and fulfilled Americans' desire for a style of architecture that symbolized their patriotism and hearkened back to their past (McAlester 1984:321 & Flaherty, Jan. 1978:1,8).

The Ernest B. Fite House is a significant example of how a national trend in domestic design was interpreted in Alabama in the 1920s. It retains a high degree of architectural integrity.

<u>Historical Summary:</u>

The Ernest Baxter Fite house and law office in Hamilton, Alabama, are located very near the earliest known court site in present Marion County, Alabama, which dates from the 1820s (Dr. John Allman, interview, April 19, 1994). A 16-acre parcel of a quarter-section purchased from the federal government in 1820 became the Fite estate (Marion County Deed Book 236, page 746).

Bloomer Rankin Fite moved to Hamilton, Alabama, in 1886 and began the practice of law. He purchased a frame law office in downtown Hamilton in 1896 and practiced from it until his death in 1919. His son, Ernest Baxter Fite (1882-1954), also a lawyer, used the office throughout his career, and for a time shared the office with his brother, who was also a lawyer (Fite Family Archives).

Ernest Baxter Fite served in the Alabama State Senate 1911-

1915, and in the Alabama House of Representatives 1915-1935. He was a long-time president of the Marion County Banking Company, and an original owner of Hamilton's first radio station. Ernest Baxter Fite, along with two brothers, is listed in the <u>Dictionary of Alabama Biography</u>. It was Ernest Baxter Fite who contracted to build the Fite house in 1927-28 (<u>Marion County News</u>, June 20, 1958).

The highest achievement in this political family came with Ernest Baxter Fite's son Rankin Fite (1916-1980), a local lawyer, World War II veteran, and state legislator. Rankin Fite was elected to the Alabama state senate in 1946. From 1950 until 1974, with the exception of one term, he served in the Alabama House of Representatives. He is the only man in Alabama history who served two terms as Speaker of the House. He also served one term as Speaker Pro-tempore, and one term as Chairman of the House Rules Committee. At different times during his legislative career, newsmen voted him "Most Outstanding Freshman Senator," "Most Effective Member of the House of Representatives," and "Best Orator in the Senate" (Journal-Record, November 13, 1980).

Fite was the primary figure both in the introduction of the significant Trade School and Junior College Bills, in some of the earliest recruitment of large industry to Hamilton and Marion County. As a result of his efforts, Marion County became the only county in the South which had a unique Industrial Development Amendment, which could enable cities in the county to float general obligation bonds to finance buildings for new industries. At the time of Fite's death, 18 new industries had been financed under this amendment (<u>Journal-Record</u>, November 13, 1980).

Fite was a member of the State Board of Education for two terms, and of the State Oil and Gas Board for one term. He served on the Board of Directors of the Tennessee-Tombigbee Waterway Project (1957-1971), and as its Chairman (1963). He was secretary and attorney for the Northwest Alabama Gas District (Fite Family Archives).

Fite served as vice-president of Marion County Banking Company during his father's presidency, and later as president himself.
