DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Pena Adobe was built in 1842 or soon after, with adobe mud from nearby Lake Laguna. Restored in 1965 using original materials, it closely resembles the original building, except the roof thatch is replaced by hand split shakes. The entire dwelling was sheathed in redwood siding prior to 1870, which acounts for its good condition when restored. Between 1870-1880 a frame addition of 24' x 18' was added. This has been <u>removed</u> short distance and is now a museum and office. Engineer Marle Curtice in charge of restoration, used the ancient method of sun-drying the bricks, and hand splitting of redwood logs to achieve the original physical appearance.

The Adobe building $18^{\circ} \times 50^{\circ}$ overall, with three rooms of varying interior dimensions. The central room - $14^{\circ} \times 20^{\circ}$ - probably was the living and dining area; the flanking rooms - $14^{\circ} \times 11\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ and $14^{\circ} \times 13\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ - were bedrooms. In Cooking was done outside at the northeast corner of the house, probably in a thatched <u>ramada</u>. Exterior walls are $22\frac{1}{2}$ thick, being laid on the typical Hispanic Era trenched cobblestone foundation. Height of the house is $1\frac{1}{2}$ stories - the topanco or attic being historically used for storage. The topanco was reached by an outside stairway. Roofing is split shingles. The restored adobe is furnished in period and is open to the public.

The restored wood frame annex, now housing a collection of local memorabilia, $\overline{\mathcal{T}}$ has been moved from its original position adjacent to the adobe, to a location nearby. This building is about 18' x 24' with split shingle of exterior sheathing and roof.

Juan Felipe Peña and Juan Manuel Vaca came in 1842 from New Mexico to settle their 44,383 acre land grant which was first called "Lihuaytos", then Los Putos. Both built adobe houses near Lake Laguna, and allowed their herds of half-wild cattle to roam from Suisun to Putah Creek. A heated controversy developed with John R. Wolfskill, first American settler in the county, over straying cattle, on his Rancho Rio de Los Putos adjacent grant, which was decided in Wolfsmill's favor. The 1892 earthquake demolished the Vaca casa, and it was not replaced. But the Peña Adobe, by which Edwin Markham (the poet) "daily rode his bucking bronco" to school, still stands (SRL534). During 1965-1966 the Peña casa was restored at cost of \$33,000. by joint action of the Solano County Historical Society, the City of Vacaville and the County of Solano. Now surrounded by about 27 acres of Pena Park, it is open to the public, with a resident curator on duty. This area was the site of a rancheria of Obloolatus (Ulatis) Indians and many of their artifacts are on exhibition in the small museum in the Park.

It should be mentioned here, that the City of Vacaville was named for Juan Manuel Vaca, who sold nine square miles to William McDaniel in 1850 for \$3000. with the provision that a city be named for the proud Don.
