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| DESCRIPTION (Continued) | On the front elevation the roof slopes down to the first story of 5 bays with central entrance. The door is flanked by fluted pilasters under plain entablature. Windows are 12/8. The house is relatively deep for its width. On the left side elevation there is a door flanked by 12/8 windows at first floor. At second floor a central 2/2 window is flanked by smaller 2/2 windows near the eaves. An attic window is 2/2. There is a central brick chimney. The house has corner boards. The modern wing to the right is similar in appearance to the main block. |

| | 19. HISTORICAL OR ARCHITECTURAL IMPORTANCE |
| SIGNIFICANCE | The house is significant architecturally because it is a good example of the type of colonial house with the high gable roof sloping down to the first story. The small windows near the eaves in the second floor of the side elevation are typical in such houses in Connecticut. |
| | Ebenezer Evans (1742-1816) moved to Conway, Massachusetts, by 1782. A later owner of the house was Anson Merriman (1786-1853) who moved here when he sold the Gad Andrews place in 1832, where he had participated in the early manufacture of cement. On this farm his grandson, Josiah H. Merriman (1834-?) had "the finest apple orchard in the town." Josiah's daughter, Sarah F. (1867-?) married Elijah Rogers in 1888. The Rogers family continues the apple orchard and cold storage business, which was started about the time of the marriage. |
