DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The firehouse was built in the early months of 1875. It is a two-story structure with a flat roof. The building is approximately 25' X 70' long, with a one-story addition to the rear, measuring 25' X 28' long. The one-story rear addition is masonry with a flat roof and a frame structure with a steep hipped roof. There is also a part basement at the rear of the two-story addition, which is approximately 25' X 25'. The front and left side are stuccoed. The rear and right side have been exposed brick exterior walls.

The structure of the firehouse has exterior masonry bearing walls, wood floors and roof beams, wood interior partitions. The interior has wood strip flooring, plastered walls, metal ornamental ceilings with ornamental metal crown moldings. The wooden trim throughout is oak.

The facade of the building was exposed brick and brownstone which is presently covered with a rough textured stucco. The original windows, doors, and wood cornice are intact.

The ornamental ceiling pattern on the interior is of egg and dart frieze (metal crown molding) installed around 1900.

The roof cornice is wood and it is solid with the Itlaianate style.

The window treatment has a flat arched lintel with an indication of drip moldings at each end made of brownstone. The center double window is treated similarly to the single windows, Except that its arch is a semi-circular with a sunburst beneath the arch.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Bayonne, New Jersey, was a small town that was rapidly developing into a city during the late 19th century. The citizens felt that one of the most important needs to urban development was protection from the menace of fire. A fire company was organized in 1870, for this purpose. It was typical of those in other blossoming cities. what was modern equipment at the time, the fire house gave the citizens the protection that was needed for development and a sense of safety.

One of the main reasons the citizens of Bayonne sought a city charter in 1869 was the need for a government strong enough to organize and control an adequate volunteer fire department.

On November 7, 1870, the Bayonne City council passed an ordinance "To establish, regulate and control a fire department in the City of Bayonne." That night a group of thirty (30) volunteers on the uptown section organized the first unit in the Bayonne Fire Department "Bayonne Hook & Ladder No. 1."

It was not, however, until 1875 that the first firehouse was The first meeting was held in June of 1875. This firehouse was used by the volunteers until 1906 when they were replaced by a full-time paid fire force. A fire alarm telegraph system was installed in 1895 which replaced the bell that was located in the tower in the rear yard. The full time department used this fire house until a larger firehouse was built on Avenue B at 56th Street in 1928. In 1929, the old firehouse was turned over to the volunteer firemens association.

The firehouse was an essential building in a growing city. Although the houses were being constructed more soundly, the threat of fire was still felt by the people. Without some type of protection from fire the people knew if a fire came, saving anything was This was the feeling that prompted the citizens to organize the Bayonne Hook and Ladder No. 1 and to get the city to build a firehouse.

This building although small is size housed the fire equipment for the City of Bayonne for over 50 years until the need for larger quarters prompted them to build another firehouse. The building
