

A detailed description of the physical characteristics of the stone is given in the Boundary Markers of the Original District of Columbia Multiple Documentation Form.

Intermediate boundary marker Northeast #5 is located in the front yard of the residence at 4609 Eastern Avenue. It is located approximately 45 feet northeast of the centerline of Eastern Avenue and 465 feet northwest of the centerline of Arundel Road. The sandstone marker is in fair condition. A 3' x 3' x 5' iron fence, in good condition, surrounds the marker.

Northeast boundary stone #5 was the twelfth marker to be located in Maryland. It was laid in 1792. Its fence was dedicated by the Constitution Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution on October 20, 1917.

Verbal Boundary Description:

The stone is located in the front yard of 4609 Eastern Avenue approximately 45 feet northeast of the centerline of Eastern Avenue and 465 feet northwest from the centerline of Arundel Road. The fence surrounds the stone.

The boundary stone and fence have historically been situated at this location and maintain historic integrity.
