#### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Upper Green River Rendezvous were held in various places near Daniel, Wyoming from 1825 to 1840. The area they encompassed was river grassland from 15 to 20 miles long and from one to five miles wide. Five of the fifteen Rendezvous were held near the junction of Horse Creek and the Green River.

The area today is little changed. U.S. 187 connects the small towns of Daniel and Pinedale, and in between lies Trapper's Point. It overlooks the Rendezvous area, greener now with the advent of irrigation. Trapper's Point is the site of the plaque designating the Rendezvous as a National Historic Landmark. Each year in July a reenactment of the Rendezvous is held in Pinedale, at a rodeo stadium located there.

#### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Of all the rendezvous sites connected with the Rocky Mountain fur trade, the most popular was that on the Green River. Of the 15 annual meetings held by the mountain men, 8 were at the Green River site, and 5 of them were held near the junction of Horse Creek and the Green River.

The Rendezvous was a colorful trading fair at which trappers, traders, and indians gathered. It was instituted in the Rocky Mountain fur trade by General William Ashley, and it effectively revolutionized the trade. Instead of a system of fixed posts to which indians and trappers came, the rendezvous was a previously established meeting place to which the great supply caravans from St. Louis brought trade goods which were exchanged for the furs. Each rendezvous lasted for a few days or at most a few weeks. The first rendezvous was held in 1825 and the last in 1840. To the meetings on the Green River came some of the foremost figures in the Rocky Mountain trade, including Ashley, Jim Bridger, Thomas Fitzpatrick, Kit Carson, Jedediah Smith, Lucien Fontenelle, James Beckwourth, the Sublettes, Andrew Drips, and Nathaniel Wyeth.

Samuel Parker and Marcus Whitman, the noted Protestant missionaries who played an important part in opening the Oregon country, came to the Green River Rendezvous of 1835 with the caravan of the American Fur Company. Father Pierre De Smet, the Belgian Jesuit missionary, accompanied an American Fur Company caravan to the Upper Green River Rendezvous in 1840, and continued on to the northern Rocky Mountain region where he carried on missionary work among the Indians for 30 years.

No trace of these rendezvous remains. The sites were varied, overlapping and not centralized. The boundary is therefore defined by the black line on the accompanying map, U.S.G.S. maps labelled "Daniel Wyo." and "Daniel Junction, Wyo.," and dated 1970. This 1200 acres contains the junction of Green River and Horse Creek, where five of the fifteen Rendezvous had their general nexus. It also contains much of the winding river and flat grassland topography which led the trappers to rendezvous here. The site is undisturbed except for a ranch house and its out-buildings, southeast of the river junction. These structures do not contribute to the national significance of the landmark.

#### **BOUNDARIES:**

As shown by the black line on the accompanying U.S.G.S. maps, the boundaries include all of section 36, R11W, T34N, and section 31, R110W, T34N, except for an 80 acre area south of a line running along the south bank of Todd Ditch.

The north 1/2 of Section 36 is owned by Miller Land and Livestock, Big Piney. The remaining area is owned by A.E. Schwabacher, Jr., Pinedale.
