#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

This house follows the traditional layout of what can be called typical PuertoRican house. All of the most "public" areas of the house face towards Post Street, where its main facade is found. Additional rooms and services run East-West from the main "body" of the residence.

Being L shaped within a slightly trapezoidal lot, the remaining space is used as garden. The house, as required by law, is raised from the ground, therefore a set of steps on its back allows access to the patio area. The wood structure rests on a concrete base, perforated for ventilation.

The front facade is symmetrical, with a balcony running all along its width. Steel columns over concrete posts support the balcony's zinc roofing. An ornate iron balaustrade relates to the more elaborate doors (4 of them) which lead into the house. These doors are double ones, with movable louvers, colored glass in two colors and ventilating transoms.

The distinct personality of this one story single family dwelling is made evident, as in most houses in Mayaguez, in the living and dining room areas. The Nazario house bears witness to the city's predilection for high interior spaces, unmistakably higher than in any other location on the Island. A "mediopunto(also called "grillé" in Mayaguez, from the french word grille) articulates both areas; its columns rising higher than usual. Ceilings in both areas use continuous ventilating devices, carved in wood, with ornamental trimmings and mouldings.

The walls exhibit stucco decorations all over in floral, arabesque—type patterns highly evocative of Rococo taste, executed, of couse, in a less sophisticated manner. The stucco was originally painted in gold leaf, walls were olive green; they are new beige and white. These decorative elements, unique in Puerto Rico was added on to the house after it was built by a local artist with Bayron as last name. Not much additional information is available.

The present owners condemned one of the house's rooms to house a jewelry store facing the street. This unfortunate decision has mutilated, in an almost "obscene" way, the serene facade. After that, any other alterations seems irrelevant; in fact, there are no others.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Nazario house's significance becomes evident as its uniqueness in the panorama of Puertorican architecture is underlined. The Nazario residence houses one of the best interior spaces ever conceived and executed on the Island (its living room).

The house embodies all main characteristics of Mayaguez' architecture; an L shaped plan, adherence to local building construction codes, astonishingly high interior spaces, diverse ventilation devices, a "mediopunto", and so on.

An then there are the stuccoed walls... On one hand, the house relates to traditional building construction, on the other, it emerges with an identity of its own, a true treasure trove with no "kin" in the rest of the Island, because of this particular ornamental resource.

Unfortunately, no information on Mr. Bayron (the artist) or Mr. Hernández (the builder/architect) has emerged so far.


