


Physical Description

This large Gothic Revival church, designed around 1921, is located on a corner lot in one of Little Rock's older residential areas. The structure's components consist of: a four bay nave or auditorium block, articulated by brick buttresses, with a gable end entrance on Louisiana Street, a blocky square tower rising at the northeast end of the auditorium at its juncture with the "transept" which is here a two-story educational wing featuring banks of casement windows. Appropriate to its function as a neighborhood church, the varied colors, textures and materials lend a somewhat informal quality to the whole, despite its large size and relatively elaborate ornamentation. The building is faced with tapestry brick in variegated shades of reddish brown; the mortar blends with the cream colored terra-cotta ornamentation. The roofing tiles are in variegated shades of terra-cotta.

A range of concrete stairs rises from the sidewalk to the principal entrance on Louisiana Street. The traditional tri-partite entrance features solid paneled doors, double leaf doors in the center flanked by two single ones. The entire entrance group is framed by two wide brick piers ornamented with large panels of terra-cotta blind tracery. The three portals are recessed within multiple moldings in Gothic arch shapes and feature tympani of stained glass. Panels of terra-cotta blind tracery form a transition from the entrances below to the large Gothic arch stained-glass window above. Four slender terra-cotta

Statement of Significance

Thompson and Harding's 1921 design for Winfield Methodist Church displayed their familiarity with the importance of integrating a structure into its setting. Built in one of Little Rock's older downtown residential neighborhoods, Winfield Methodist Church was constructed twenty to thirty years after most of the structures in its neighborhood. Again the use of Gothic Revival influence was used by the firm in its design for an Arkansas church. Although Winfield Methodist Church is a large structure with rather elaborate ornamentation, it conveys a somewhat informal quality through the use of materials: reddish-brown tapestry brick with creamcolored mortar that matches the terra-cotta ornamentation. Like the firm's Cfaftsman houses, the varied textures and earth tones of the building lend an informal, neighborhood quality to this Gothic Revival inspired church.

piers extend upwards dividing the entrance into three bays and continuing upward to divide the stained glass window as well. The stained glass panels of this window terminate in terra-cotta trefoil cusps. The sides of the auditorium are articulated by triple lancet windows of stained glass with trefoil cusps. The large, square bell tower is capped by a wide terra-cotta band featuring crosses in relief, its openings formed by twin lancet window shapes crowned with cinquefoil tracery and ornamental bosses.


