Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Tecumseh Opera House is located on the west side of courthouse square at 123 South 3rd St., in the historic downtown Tecumseh district. Constructed in 1880 by W. R. Spicknell and W. H. Hassett of bricks manufactured by Spicknell in Tecumseh, the building was purchased by Henry Goodman, a "popular young merchant" (*Johnson County Journal, 6 May 1980*) before its completion. The Two-Part Commercial Block structure measures 76 feet wide by 80 feet long; the architect was Mr. W. L. Dunlap. It has a pitched, tar-covered roof, which has sustained some rain damage but was subsequently repaired. Access to the second-floor auditorium is by way of a wide stairway on the north end of the building. No ticket window remains.

The auditorium is 39 feet wide by 60 feet, 6 inches long, with five windows at the east end, overlooking Third Street. The theatre contains no balcony. The original molded white tin ceiling remains, although it and the walls have sustained rain damage. The lower three feet of the walls and the area below the stage have wooden wainscoting. The wooden floor is in excellent condition. Storage space for wooden folding chairs is under the stage.

The proscenium arch measures 20 feet wide by approximately 11 feet high. The wing space on stage right extends 10 feet, while the stage left side is one foot shorter. The stage floor is 18 feet deep from the proscenium opening to the back wall. The stage has no apron, though a footlight trough does extend beyond the proscenium opening. There are no trap doors. A vintage advertising front curtain hangs unrolled at the front of the stage, although it postdates the opera house era. The original scenery was painted by W. O. Thomas, Scenic Artist, of Macomb, Illinois.

The structural and historical integrity of the building and theatre has been preserved.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Tecumseh Opera House is significant for its association with and in reference to the historic context "Aesthetic Systems: Itinerant and Local Performing Arts in Nebraska" and the property type of "Opera House Buildings in Nebraska, 1867 to 1917." Under Criterion A, this opera house is significant in the areas of the performing arts; entertainment/recreation; and social history, on a state level, as a well preserved example of an opera house building in Nebraska. The building retains a high degree of historical integrity, possessing the physical and associative characteristics to make it an eligible member of its property type.

This opera house is significant in the area of performing arts for bringing a variety of entertainment to the community of Tecumseh. As a facility for the performing arts, it offered productions such as musical concerts; touring stock companies; performers like John Dillon, Maude Atkinson, Katie Putnam, and Wood & Ward; classics like *Uncle Tom's Cabin, Monte Cristo, East Lynne*, and *The House of a Thousand Candles*; minstrel shows, including the annual Tecumseh Ticklers; grand and comic opera; dialect comedies; and home talent shows. (See following table of Representative Entertainments 1881-1917.)

This opera house is significant in the area of entertainment/recreation, since it provided a place where the whole community could gather to attend dances, edifying or entertaining lectures, temperance meetings, and moving pictures. (See following table of Representative Entertainments 1881-1917.)

This opera house is significant in the area of social history because it gave Tecumseh a neutral, nonaffiliated location for political meetings, church socials and bazaars, basketball, and school entertainments. (See following table of Representative Entertainments 1881-1917.) In the days before radio, television, and sound movies, activities at the opera house were anticipated for days or weeks ahead of time. It provided a place for people to get together to have a good time and forget their troubles over crops, weather, taxes, the railroads, and the generally hard life of settling the Great Plains.

The two-story rectangular brick building has a flat roof with parapet wall and exhibits brick corbelling as the main decorative element of the primary facade. Fenestration consists of tall, narrow double-hung windows with segmentally arched openings and brick segmentally-arched window hoods. The street level facade has been modernized with new brick, plate glass windows and an aluminum awning. The transom windows have been covered with metal panels.

The first level retail space orginally housed a barber shop and restaurant, and is currently used as a drug store. The opera house space is vacant.

The period of significance is derived from the original construction date of the building, 1880, only eight years after the arrival of the railroad line to town. It continued through 1917, the year considered to signal the end of the opera house era in Nebraska, based on declining numbers of touring companies nationally and rising numbers of movie houses and automobiles. The Electric (Movie) Theatre took considerable business away from the Tecumseh Opera House; coupled with the Auburn Auditorium (21 miles), a first floor structure, competition and expenses restricted the Tecumseh Opera House to offering only sporadic events dwindling in quantity year by year after 1917, primarily significant in the area of social history.
