Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Claiborne Parish Courthouse is set on a square near the center of the small town of Homer. Only two of the original live oak trees remain on the square.

Although the building dates from 1860, it has been substantially reworked numerous times over the years. A 1964 renovation obliterated any evidence of the original appearance of the interiors. Sources suggest that at one time the courtroom was downstairs, but in the early-twentieth century it was moved upstairs. In any case, after 1964, the historic fabric of the courthouse consisted largely of a shell.

The following features remain intact from the original building:

- 1. the common bond brick walls
- 2. most of the original window and door openings
- 3. the brick Doric colonnade which surrounds the building
- 4. the pyramid roof
- 5. the cupola

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph) Criteria A and C

The Claiborne Parish Courthouse is significant on the state level in the area of architecture because, despite the loss of much of the original architectural fabric, the remaining building is still the only example of a two-story Greek Revival peripteral style structure in the northern part of the state. In addition, it is one of four extant antebellum courthouses in Louisiana.

The Claiborne Parish Courthouse is significant in the area of politics/government because it has been the seat of parish government since its construction in 1860.
