

45. Description and House Plan:

One and one half story brick residence with exterior end chimneys. Chimneys are five course common bond and have sloped shoulders reminiscent of the tidewater tradition. The front or west facade is five bay, flemish bond with jack arches over the windows, doors, and cellar vents. The front facade features two doors side by side. Interior proportions suggest that the house was built in two stages, but there is no interuption of the brick patter on the exterior facade. A corbelled brick cornice runs under the eaves on the the east and west facades. The second floor rooms are accessible only by stair opening off back porch. One room brick ell on North portion of east side. Frame ell attached to brick. House has stone foundation. The base of the front porch is concrete with wood posts and trim from the late 19th centur The gable roof of the house is tin. Two original window sashes on the left side of the front facade are 9 over 6. Doors and window on the right side are 20th century moddification. Dormers in the roof were added in the early 20th century. (cont.)



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Statement of Significance

The Morrison House is significant under criterion C for the period 1800 to 1817 as an example of a brick single-pile, central passage house with Federal details such as Flemish bond brick work and jack arches. It is unusual in Madison County for its houndstooth brick cornice and two doorways on the main facade.

Verbal Boundary Justification

The boundary follows the fence line because it seprates the domestic space associated with the dwelling from the fields and agricultural buildings and provides a minimal setting for the house.

The boundary contains one contributing building, three noncontributing buildings, and one non-contributing object.

45. There are two outbuildings which were built after the period of significance for the Morrison House. They are gableroofed rectangular structures with vertical wood siding.
