This is a good example of the "McClelland ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE house" -- one of Davenport's most distinctive 19th century house forms. executed in frame construction, the characteristic two-story, three-bay front-gable form is embellished with elements typical of the period: window surrounds with shallow, broken cornices, and a bracketted porch with rather unusual spiral motif in the columns. Like many other houses of this form included in the survey, this example illustrates one of the many ways in which a very basic form was adapted, through applied decoration, to individual owners' tastes and prevailing architectural fashions.

HISTORICAL DATA W.S. Cameron occupied this house beginning in 1884, though the building itself may be older. Cameron was the owner/proprietor of the firm W.S. Cameron & Sons, clothing retailers.


