The Cottonwood School is a one story, detached, frame building with clapboard siding. Six large windows are located on the north wall. Four transom lights and a projecting basement entry are on the west wall. A gable roofed entr with a central door flanked by two windows projects from the south wall. In 1965, a classroom addition was attached to the east wall. The addition does not substantially detract from the building's integrity or original form.

Plew's bulletin on school house design, published in 1919. Essentially, the Cottonwood School is a gable ended form with an entry placed off to the side. It is the only extant example of this type of design in Gallatin County.
