Retains central dividing hall that runs from front to rear of building. Stone basement. Aluminum siding encloses front porch. Building tuckpointed in 1978, screened-in porch enclosed. Interior converted for use as Millinery Shop, large rounded wood arch in northeast downstairs front room. Porch was stucco frame. Stone lintels.

"Front gable style": The Fuerste House is a local adaptation of the temple form Greek Revival. The result is the vernacular "Front gable style." Worthy of note is the unadorned tin roof, the four bay width and five bay length. This home made of local brick represents one of the most decorative styles in Guttenberg.
