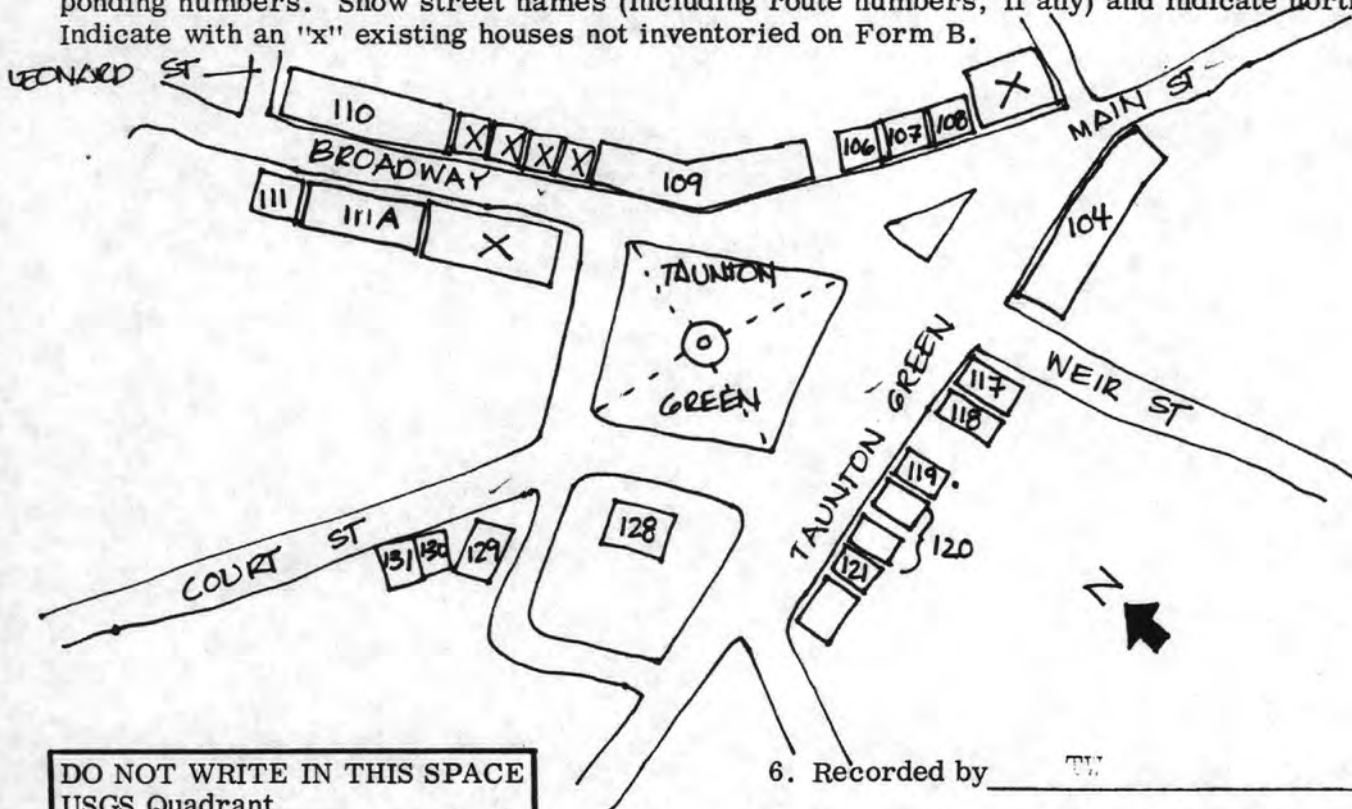

Significance (cont.)

By the turn of the century, new construction began to replace the lavish residences that still occupied the Green's border, as central city space became more valuable. The Crocker building (#129) replaced part of the Samuel Crocker Estate in 1900, providing needed office space for downtown professionals. Several banks modernized their facilities: the Bristol County National Bank (#121) added a Neoclassical facade in 1893, and the Taunton bank (#'s 130, 131) appended a Beaux Arts addition to its pre-existent Victorian Italianate bank in 1913. Seeing little construction after this period, the last dramatic change to the District's appearance occurred when the city's Richardson Romanesque Post Office was replaced in 1931 by a WPA-produced Neoclassical structure (#128).

The Taunton Green is the visual focal point of the district. Originally covering over 88 acres, the Green was a training field for Colonists in the 17th century. The Green is surrounded by a fence made of posts made from Quincy granite and the rails were made by the Old Colony Iron Works. The fence was erected in 1840-41.

There are various monuments in the Green:

- 1) A boulder with plaque on the north side facing the courthouse was erected October 15, 1897 by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts commemorating General David Cobb and 400 militia who defeated a body of insurgents in Shay's Rebellion in their attempt to prevent a session of the Supreme Judicial Court in 1786; also commemorated is the raising of the Liberty and Union Flags on October 21, 1774.
- 2) Civil War - Soldiers and Sailors Monument on east side. Granite statue of Union soldier presented to GAR by Cyrus H. Lothrop in 1902.
- 3) Spanish-American War Veterans on west side. Bronze statue of a soldier given by Fred Dean in July 1937.
- 4) World War I on south side. Bronze statue of a "doughboy" erected by the Veterans of Foreign Wars in 1937 in Memorial Park and moved to the Green in 1977. Sculptor, Louis Leach and model George Mandigo, a local resident.

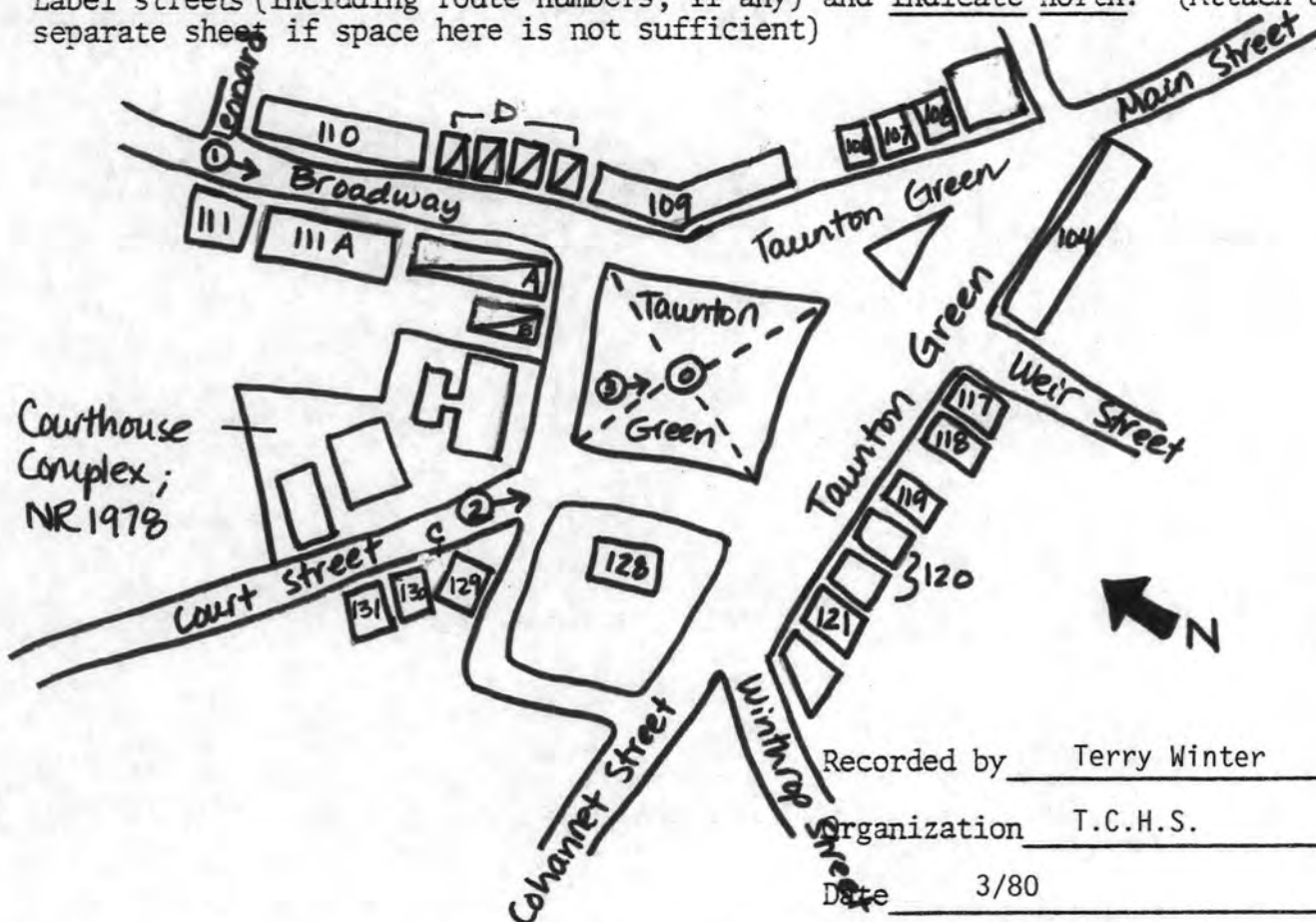

The Taunton Green National Register District incorporates the city's major public park and the most outstanding commercial structures in the Central Business District. Together with the Courthouse Complex (NR, 1978), which it abuts on the northwest, the area displays a contiguous array of public and private 19th and early 20th century architecture that represents the city's rise to prominence as a manufacturing and retailing center.

Contributing buildings are those 19th and early 20th century structures which retain integrity of design and reflect the historical character of the district in their use and associations with the commercial and municipal development of the city.

Boundaries were drawn to include the highest concentration of contributing buildings around the Taunton Green, which is the historical center of the city's commercial district. The Green is characterized by continuous rows of multi-story masonry buildings lining Main Street, Broadway and the north and east corners of Taunton Green. To the west and south of the Green are freestanding institutional buildings (Courthouse Complex, Post Office) set on open landscaped lots. Commercial uses continue south and west on Cohannet and Winthrop Streets, but consist primarily of low-rise post-1940 buildings. Additionally, the topography begins to slope down away from Taunton Green at its south-east corner, along Cohannet and Winthrop Streets. To the northeast, altered 19th century commercial buildings characterize Main Street outside the district, while to the northwest, Broadway assumes a more residential character as it proceeds westward.

Several 20th century structures, either of recent construction or which have lost design integrity through extensive recent alterations, are considered non-contributing. These include A, a ca. 1960 one-story row of stores, "Liberty Lane", B, a small one-story office complex adjacent to the Courthouse Complex and a vacant lot (c) on Court Street, and D, a sequence of four one-story "taxpayer" storefronts at 19, 20 and 21-22 Taunton Green.

Granted by the proprietors to the town for use as a training field in 1743, Taunton Green has been the seat of public affairs since the mid-18th century. Facing the town's first courthouse, built in 1772, the Green served during Revolutionary War years as the site of the first flying of the Liberty and Union Flag (1774), and of the defeat of followers of Shay's rebellion (1786). During this period, the Green's periphery began to attract commercial enterprises with the establishment of several taverns, inns and stores. By the early 19th century, this trend was in full force. Frame stores and brick commercial blocks in the Federal style typified this development. The row at 44 and 45-49 Taunton Green (#119, #120) is an excellent example of this construction. In the years leading to the Civil War, the commercial district reflected the prosperity of Taunton's diverse industries in the construction of several brick and brownstone banks and stores. An outstanding and formal survivor of this period is the Bank Block (#106, #107, #108) of ca. 1855, a striking group of brick and brownstone buildings detailed in Renaissance Revival mode.

After a serious fire destroyed portions of Main Street to the east of the Green in 1859, rebuilding took place. One of the major commercial monuments of this period is the Union Block of 1860 (#104), which popularized both semi-fireproof construction and demonstrated the practicality of the business block as an alternative to independent commercial units. 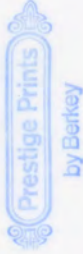

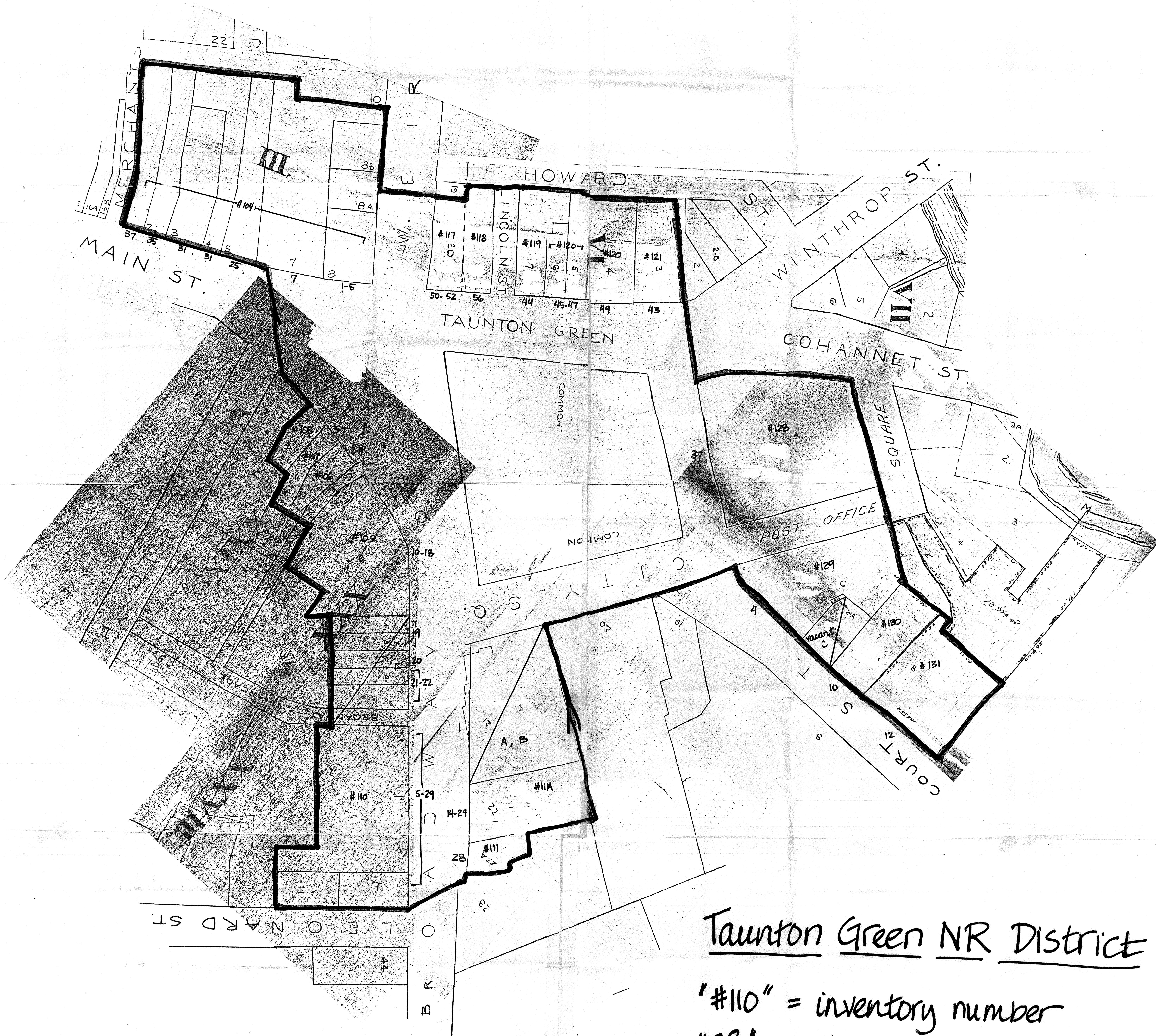
