# Narrative Description

The Río Hondo Bridge is located on kilometer 26.9 of Route 156 between Comerío and Barranquitas (Photo 1). It stands on monumental abutments, 22 feet above the Hondo River. It has wing walls in rubble masonry with buttresses and vertical ashlar corner courses (Photo 2). Attractive open-web joists support the deck.

This truss span was set in 1881 as one of three spans of the Reyes Católicos Bridge over the Plata River. In 1899 a hurricane destroyed one of the other spans. The truss was slightly altered for installation in the present site in 1908. The bridge and its setting have suffered no significant alterations since the period of significance. With respect to its present site (since 1908) the structure posseses a high degree of integrity of design, workmanship, feeling, association, materials, and setting.

#### Narrative Statement of Significance

This metal span was made by "Participation Belgue" originally for the 1881 Reyes Católicos Bridge over the Plata River on the San Juan-Mayagüez road. It survived the bridge's partial destruction by San Ciriaco Hurricane in 1899.

In 1908 it was installed at its present site by orders of the Superintendent of Public Work Juan-José Jiménez after modifications designed by Eng. Rafael Nones. The bridge became part of the old Comerío-Barranquitas road that provided access to the city of Barranquitas. This is the oldest bridge truss left in Puerto Rico. Its open web transverse joists are unique.
