Interior not inspected.

The house was enlarged by building a similar 3 bay 2 story common bond brick house E of stone house, separated by a passage way later bricked in; then a 2 story brick rectangular ell of Italianate style was added to N side & wider eaves & matching brackets added to brick house; stone house probably stuccoed and painted to match at some time.

The yard included a mounded cemetery in the N.E. corner having a carved slab monument bearing the inscription:

" In memory of
Issac Newland
Born October 25, 1752
Died September 22, 1808 "

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at the corner of the yard beyond the cemetery hill, thence S 100 ft to B, thence with fence 200 ft west to C, 100 ft N to D, and 200 ft E to beginning, containing the stone house, with additions, yard and cemetery. No other early buildings remain. about 1/2 acre
