

DESCRIPTION: (cont.) included in projecting entrance are single windows flanking the central doorway; windows have stone arches w/cornice molding and drip molding ending in a squared stop; remaining windows on 1st floor have stone voussiors in flat arching w/stone imposts; 2nd floor windows include 4 bays over central entrance which repeat design of side windows flanking entrance; remaining 2nd floor windows on facade are round arched w/brick voussiors and stone key, pronounced archivolt stone trim w/stone imposts; stone sills on all windows; brick work shows alternating 5 stretcher, 1 header coursing; bldg. has hip roof w/gables over front and rear entrance; dentils under cornice and gables; gable on front contains 3 round arched windows w/rock faced stone arching; rear gable contains brick panel and 2 round arched windows; windows on bldg. sides are flat arched w/brick voussiors; windows on rear entrance are segmental arched.

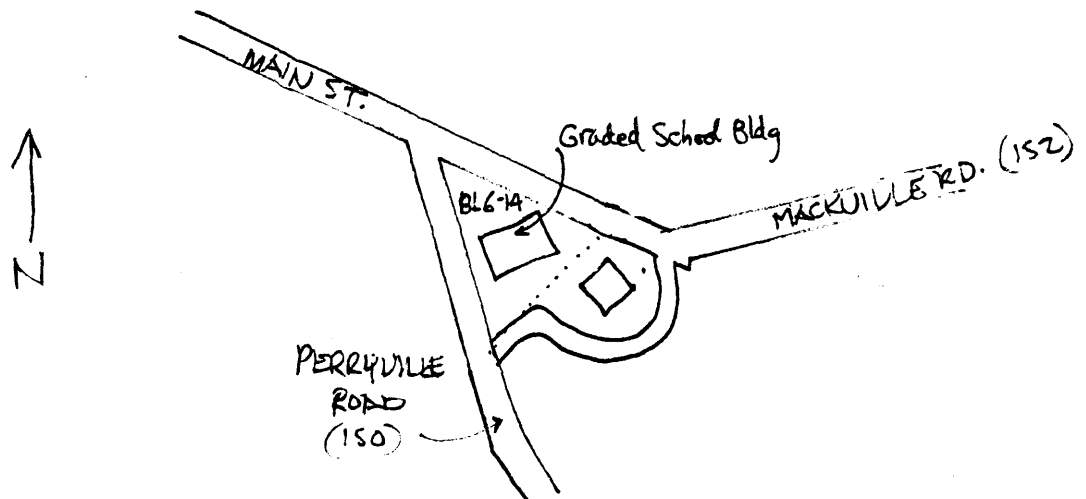

Town Lot BL6-14: northeastern half of lot forming a nearly equilateral triangle Beginning at point A, proceeding 300' along the south side of Main street east to point B, thence 300' along the line of a drive southwest to point C, thence 300' northwest along the east side of the Perryville Rd to the point of origin. The bound- were chosen to include the school and its immediate schoolyard as defined by streets and drives. The property contains one contributing building and no noncon- tributing buildings.
