There is a partial basement and the laundry room is on the first floor. A partition was removed from the front bedroom to make a bedroom from the former bedroom and sewing room. There is built in storage apace under the roof, and no attic. The partitions are 143/4" thick.

This house is architecturally significant because it is one of a group of stone masonry houses built in Milwaukee County by Arnold F. Meyer according to Ernest Flagg; s system of construction. It is the first house of this group to be built in Milwaukee County. The plan for the house is similar to one on plate 20B in Flagg's book on small houses. It is also like the McCall Magazine demonstration home of 1924.
