SUMMARY OF PRESENT AND ORIGINAL PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

7246 San Carlos is a two-story, T-shaped Spanish styled building constructed of stucco over hollow tile with a clay barrel tile hip roof. A stucco buttressed chimney with a barrel tile shed roof is located on the front (east) facade of the building. Windows are three-lite wood casement with cast stone sills. A small four-lite wood casement window with a wrought iron grille is located to the north of the chimney on the first story. To the east of the chimney is a pair of five-lite french doors which open onto a terrace which runs north and south across the second and third bays of the building. The first bay consists of a double-arched opening supported by twisted columns with Ionic capitals. Above this opening is a wrought iron balcony. The building is in good condition and is largely unaltered. See photo #2.

SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

7246 San Carlos is significant as one of the 25 remaining structures built as part of the San Jose Estates development, a planned, self-contained suburban community developed in 1925 by a group of Jacksonville businessmen at the height of the Florida Land Boom. As do the majority of the original San Jose structures, the building reflects the Spanish or Meditteranean Revival style of architecture developed for the subdivision by the Jacksonville architects Marsh and Saxelbye. The building possesses sufficient architectural integrity and historic significance through association with the San Jose development to be individually eligible for nomination as part of the accompanying thematic nomination.

TEXT SUPPORTING SUMMARY OF STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

7246 San Carlos is one of 18 homes which were built in 1925 on lots owned by the builder O. P. Woodcock, with mortgage on property held by the San Jose Estates Corporation. Original selling price of this lot was \$4,000.00. When the San Jose Estates Corporation failed to meet its mortgage payments on the property, the building became part of a long series of litigation involving San Jose Estates, O. P. Woodcock Company, Charles Polacheck Company, R. B. Middleton, Maryland Trust Company, Baltimore Trust Company and others. Clear title was not established until 1934 when suit was brought by Christopher Point Company, O. P. Woodcock sold the house to John Athey in 1946. The house was sold three more times before being sold to the present owner in 1959. The building is in good condition and remains largely unaltered.
