Description:

The two story rectangular building that houses the Princess-Sweet Shop is a noteworthy example of Art Deco design from 1935. Located in the middle of the 600 block of Washington, on the south side of the street, the brick structure measures 21'x120', with the narrow end facing the street. The flat roof slopes gently to the rear. The west elevation of the building is now exposed due to a fire which demolished the adjacent building. This brick wall has been covered with stucco for both aesthetic and practical reasons.

The facade of the Princess is outstanding. The street level is of black Carrara glass with a pale green linear design at the corners and sides. The second floor is now of pink stucco, but originally it was painted green to match the lower level. Note the dark zig-zag treatment at the sides of the building, enframing the second floor windows. These two windows are high-lighted by the use of a slightly darker tone around them, expanding in a zig-zag effect near the sill. The street level is asymmetrical due to a stairway entrance located on the right (west) side. The storefront itself is symmetrical, with a recessed entry and large plate glass display windows. The Carrara glass is located both above and below these windows. Trim on the building is of "pitco" metal. "Princess" is spelled out in elongated stylized letters above the door. A long narrow sign directly above the entrance announces "Air-Conditioned." The neon sign on which extends out from the facade was designed by the Pioneer Neon Sign Company of Minneapolis and was one of the largest in central Iowa in 1935. With the exception of the change in the color of the second floor stucco, the facade appears unaltered.

The interior also retains a very high level of integrity. It can best be described in the words written for the <u>Iowa Falls Citizen</u> at the time of the formal opening in July 1935.

The first floor will be given over to the retail candy, ice cream and cafe business... Interior fixtures will include a candy case at the north end of the west wall, three large candy cases and display shelves on the east wall and 24 large, comfortable dining booths.

All the fixtures were custom-built for the Princess by Robert Brand & Sons Company of Osh Kosh, Wisconsin. They are of two-tone walnut. Panels of figured oriental walnut of light shades, imported from Africa, will be placed at the ends of the tables in the booths. Attached to each panel will be a mirror 20x24 inches and a modernistic indirect lighting fixture. Avodire veneer and American black walnut will be used in the booth suits, which will have carved rosettes inlaid at the ends. The same materials will be used in the candy cases, display cases, for wall paneling and for panels inside the front display windows. The tables will have black formic(a) tops with white metal edges. The new fountain is 25 feet long and of the most modern design, electrically refrigerated throughout.

The only apparent change from the above description is that one of the candy cases is missing. Otherwise, the article is as accurate today as it was in 1935.

Significance:

The Princess-Sweet Shop is locally significant under Criterion C as an outstanding example of Art Deco design from 1935. Although it is not being nominated under Criterion A, it is of local interest due to its origins by Greek emigrants who commonly established candy shops around the country. The period of significance is based on the year of construction.

The Carrara glass facade, and streamlined woodwork of the interior are typical of Art Deco design of the 1920s and '30s, but a rarity in a small town in Iowa. The owners displayed a great deal of faith in the architect, and in the people of Iowa Falls too. The design for the Princess was as unusual as the Spanish Colonial Revival style band shell design had been several years earlier.

The first Princess opened in Iowa Falls on November 20, 1915 and two years later the Sweet Shop opened a half block west of the Princess, with H.K. Pergakis in charge. In 1928 Perkagis and E.J. Karrys (both immigrants from a small Greek town) consolidated and the business was operated from the Princess site (607 Washington) under the name Princess-Sweet Shop. On Christmas Day 1934 a fire left only a brick shell. The decision was made to rebuild on the same site, and architect L.L. Klippel was selected to draw the plans. Klippel had been in Iowa Falls for only a short while, but had already achieved a local reputation. (He was responsible for the 1931 Spanish Colonial Revival style band shell in Estes Park.) The community was somewhat surprised when a drawing of the new facade was released to the newspaper. The old red brick front was to be totally remodeled into an "ultra-modern design."

"Harry and Ernie told me to build the outstanding cafe in the middle west" stated Mr. Klippel, "to accomplish this feat, we inspected outstanding cafes in cities throughout the middle west, studied plans of famous places throughout the United States, and finally took the best points of a number of them and incorporated them into the 'new' Princess. The facade, with its Carrara black glass and pitco metal, is patterned after the famous Commodore of Watertown, New York."

Not only was the design modern, both inside and out, but the equipment was the last word in efficiency and convenience. It was the first building in town to be air conditioned. Gas ranges replaced the old wood and coal stoves that had been used before the fire, and gas water heaters provided sufficient water for the washing and sterilizing of the dishes. The total cost for the building and equipping of the Princess was approximately \$30,000. This, in the middle of the Depression. It was explained by one of the owners,

We realize that we are investing an unusually large sum for such a business in a city the size of this, but Iowa Falls is our home. We expect to remain here.We have all the faith in the world in this community and we believe that the people will appreciate the fact that we are giving them the best to be had.

Significance (continued):

When the Princess-Sweet Shop reopened the citizens of Iowa Falls could once more treat themselves to Princess "Velvet" ice cream, Princess Home Made Candies, and Chinese food. The week of the opening Mr. Perkagis "announced the return to the Princess-Sweet Shop of Yee Foong Young, the Chinese chef who was connected with the Princess before the fire. Mr. Young will again specialize in the preparation of Chinese dishes for patrons of the cafe."

The Princess remained in business until 1987. In 1960 Harry Pergakis died and Karrys ran the business for a short time and then sold it. In 1970 Margaret Perkagis Barberra's husband bought the Princess for her as a birthday gift. She, and later her son, ran the business until 1987 when it closed. It was purchased by the present owners in 1992. While most of the original fixtures remain, not enough of the candy making equipment could be located, so handmade candy from Des Moines is sold instead.

The Princess-Sweet Shop retains such a high level of integrity that Pergakis and Karrys would feel right at home. It speaks of the elegance of design that was favored during the dark days of the Great Depression.
