The one-story frame cottage immediately to the west of the William Randolph House is the only similar building in the area. It has handsome bracketing around the front porch columns. However, it would be very difficult to justify its significance as a separate nomination to the National Register, and there are not enough buildings to nominate a district.

The William Randolph Home was the first building in Cross Plains, Tennessee. It served as a stop on the Gallatin, Tennessee, to Hopkinsville, Kentucky, stage route. The Cross Plains post office was located in this home from 1828 until 1969. This house is typical of the early dwelling that served as residence, tavern, inn, post office, and stage stop. As it was remodeled from time to time, it took on the appearance of the clapboard Tennessee vernacular house with the two-story porch which was so popular in the state in the mid-nineteenth century.

The nomination was submitted as one of local significance only, and there is no history pertaining to the building other than the fact that it was the first building erected in Cross Plains, it served as a stagecoach stop, and later served over 140 years It is a very important landmark for the small as a post office. town of Cross Plains and for Robertson County. Its place in the development of the area for over 150 years, serving as a residence, tavern, inn, stage stop, and post office, is certainly significant to the area, although no events of major historical importance occurred there.
