DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Boulder Main Post Office is a rectangular building with Renaissance Revival and Classical detailing. The front elevation of the original structure is defined by five recessed panels topped with segmental arches. The main entrance is located in the center of the original building. (1910) The structure has a hipped metal roof. The lobby has white plaster walls, a terrazzo floor and marble wainscotting.

LOCAL CONTEXT

Boulder was established in 1859 as a supply center for mining activity in the mountains to the west. The name comes from the profusion of boulders in the vicinity. It is the county seat. The post office is centrally located in the community's principal commercial district. The general area contains a large number of late-19th century and early-20th century buildings.

The post office is within the Downtown Boulder National Register Historic District (established 1980 which contains 168 properties, including the post office, between 9th and 16th and Walnut and Pine Streets.

A site topographic survey (1909) indicates that the site was originally vacant except for a one-story brick commercial building of approximately 4,500 square feet located in the north-western corner of the site (Lots 7 por. and 8 por.). There are no known archaeologic or paleontologic sites within or adjacent to the site. Additional subsurface investigation does not appear to be warranted. Basement construction has probably eliminated any trace of previous structures.

PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The building appears to be in excellent structural condition and both it and the grounds are well maintained.

The rectangular building's main entrance faces east. The one and one-half story structure is constructed of tan brick and terracotta and limestone detailing. The lobby floors are

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terrazzo, with marble wainscotting. The workroom floor is linoleum. The original building has a hipped metal roof, while the additions have flat composition roofs. There have been three remodelings; the first, a major addition in 1932-33; the second, a minor addition in 1959; and the third, the addition of solar panels in 1980.

The building contains a number of specific features not commonly found on post office buildings of this period. Features of note include: the metal hipped roof over the 1910 portion of the building with three hooded dormer windows facing the front entrance; brickwork suggestive of pilasters; rectangular casement windows recessed and outlined in brick with oversized limestone keystones further having oversized keystone; the pedimented front is pieced over the front (east) and side (south) doors; limestone blocks defining the basement; a simple parapet with limestone detailing, large chimney with over-size keystones above the rectangular side vents and original iron freestanding lamps flanking the front entrance and wall-mounted lamps flanking the side entrance.

The site is roughly 150 by 220 feet (33,171 square feet). The building takes up nearly the entire site, and has a small amount of parking and a loading dock are adjacent the west elevator.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

SPECIFIC DATES 1910, 1932-33, 1959

The Boulder Post Office is a well preserved and rare example of the type of post office building constructed during James Knox Taylor's tenure as Supervising Architect. The building is a notable interpretation of Classical and Renaissance Revival styling and has considerable urban design significance in relation to the town's civic center.

ARCHITECTURE

The structure is consistent with the design concepts prevalent during the administration of James Knox Taylor. Portions of the building are clearly inspired by French Neo-classicism, in particular the metal hipped roof and the three hooded dormer windows. However, the basic symmetry relates to Renaissance Revival design, as interpreted by Beaux-Arts inspired architects in the Office of the Supervising Architect.

The Boulder Main Post Office has importance on the state and local levels as a particularly sophisticated and refined example of Taylor's Renaissance Revival and Beaux-Arts inspired designs, and of the intended didactic quality of federal buildings in the early years of this century. On a local level the Boulder Main post Office is one of the best, if not the best, example of Beaux-Arts influenced architecture in the community.

The post office building is listed in the Boulder Downtown Historic District although it is not well documented. None Known.
