rear; brick top on wing chimney; 1 story 20th C

House boarded up; interior not seen.

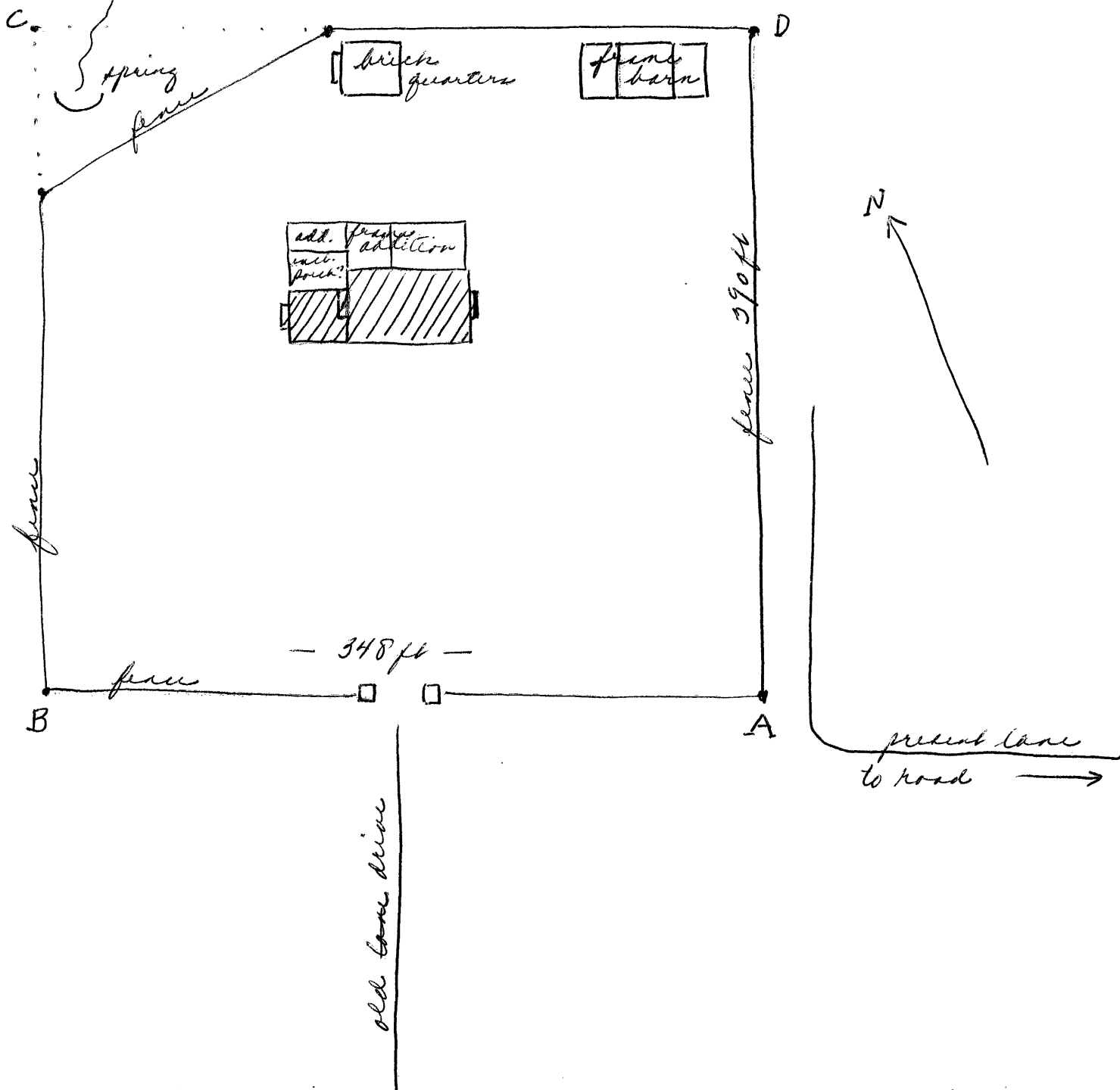

House located on gentle hilltop at end  
of long driveway to Lancaster Pike (now closed),  
"Martin" on gate posts. Drop NW of house  
to spring. Brick quarters in rear yard. (photo 5)

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A, at the SE corner of the yard, thence W fence, 348 ft W to B, 390 ft N to C, 348 ft E to D, and 390 ft S to the beginning, going outside the fence in the NW corner to include the spring. Boundary contains stone house, brick quarters, and later barn - about 3 acres.
