Significant as an excellent example of the sophisticated bungalow in Florence, this structure makes use of two local building materials, adobe and cobblestone. This building is the largest of two Florence bungalows built of adobe (see #21) and the largest of two Florence bungalows making extensive use of cobblestone (see #24). The Huffman House is one of the best-preserved historic buildings in Florence.
