ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Suter House is a one-and-a-half-story, multi-gable, frame residence. On the gable-fronted facade, its main gable is enriched with carved and turned millwork; the southwest corner is dominated by a gable-front polygonal ell with a hip-roof pent. A carved sunburst design fills the gable. A rounded-corner hip-roof porch encircles the facade and east elevation of the ell and is embellished with turned posts and balusters, brackets and a spool-and-spindle frieze.

ALTERATIONS: House moved to south end of property ca. 1960. Originally faced now-largely commercial Howard Avenue. Large shed dormer added to north elevation.
