### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Colonel E. M. Heigho residence is a two-and-one-half-story Georgian Revival house constructed of painted red brick. An outset center bay dominates the facade with its one-story portico with Roman Doric columns. A framed second story doorway leads to the portico's roof-balcony with its iron balustrade. A gable pediment with a fanlight caps the outset bay. A pair of tall dormers flank the gable and accentuate the gabled roof. The gables have returns and the roof's slight cornice is denticulated. The roof has been covered with metal.

All windows are double hung sash with cut stone sills and brick lintels. A onestory sun porch forms a wing off the right side. A one story frame addition, placed on the rear, detracts slightly from the structure's overall appearance.

In recent years this house was converted into a hotel, but the present owners are once again making it a single family dwelling.

# 8 SIGNIFICANCE

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Colonel E. M. Heigho residence is architecturally significant as a good example of a Georgian revival house with its attention to classical details and form. As such the building, which sits on a large corner lot along Highway 55, is a New Meadows landmark.

The house is also significant for its association with Colonel Edgar M. Heigho. Colonel Heigho was president and general manager of the Pacific and Idaho Northern Railroad for which New Meadows was the terminus and headquarters. He was also president and general manager of the Central Idaho Telegraph and Telephone Company; president and general manager of the Coeur d'or Development Company, which owned the New Meadows townsite; vice president and a director of the Weiser National Bank; and a director of the Meadows Valley Bank.

When the Pacific and Idaho Northern railroad was completed to New Meadows in late 1911 the town of Meadows relocated there. The development company erected several brick buildings including a hotel, depot, schoolhouse and a bank. At the same time Colonel Heigho had contractor George Brinson erect this dwelling. It and the depot are the outstanding extant buildings of New Meadows' early years.

H. W. Bond, who designed the residence, was a prominent architect from Weiser. He designed the other brick buildings in New Meadows and also the development company's hotel in Council and numerous buildings and residences in the Weiser area.
