all exterior wood has been replaced, center rear door moved to W. bay, 1st floor W. end window closed, 1 window 2nd floor on W. end, 2 windows E end 1st floor (end windows unusual if original); stone was once covered w. stucco, (photo 6) now removed & totally repointed w. concrete.

Interior not seen, ~~but said to contain chain railing throughout, and ash floor remained.~~

Transitionally

Frank Rivalet brick house built a few feet N. of stone house, connected by an enclosed loggeway, now covered w. stone. Flemish bond brick on front; (photo 3) flat brick arches over windows; mitered corners, splayed frames, 9/16 ash; sidelights & transom around center door; interior end chimney, fine iron downspout heads. 2 story shed roof and 2nd floor balcony added on front; 1 story shed roof side porch E. side enclosed w. stone.

House located on top of hill rising from road to Frankfurt, near N. Eckhorn. 20th C stone fence surrounds yard front & sides. Pyramid roof Beut Art garage (photo 5) on E side in front of old flower garden; root cellar in yard now walled w. concrete blocks; 2 room frame quarters in rear yard, unaltered. 20th C stone gate posts at entrance, inscribed "Brown" & "Eckhorn".

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at the fence corner in the SE corner of the yard, thence W with fence ^{ca 200 ft} to stone fence at B, thence with stone fence N, E, and S around the yard to the beginning, containing the stone house, brick house and frame quarters - about there.
