

7. Description

This 8.5 mile section of state maintained Route 66 serves as a frontage road along Interstate 40 west of Albuquerque. A portion of what was referred to as the Laguna Cut-off in the early 1930s, the road was paved and became a part of straightened Route 66 in 1937, serving as a part of the highway until it was replaced by I-40 after 1956. Marked by a scenic descent from Nine Mile Hill into the Rio Puerco Valley and a through truss bridge across the steeply eroded banks of Rio Puerco, this portion of Route 66 is largely unaltered and conveys a strong feeling of travel along Route 66 in the 1930s and 40s.

The road section crosses a segment of the basin and range that characterizes Route 66 through the mid-portion of the state. Rising out of the Rio Puerco Valley, the road section climbs more than 500 ft., a climb marked by several slope cuts and small concrete box culverts, to an elevation of over 5,700 ft. at its eastern end at Nine Mile Hill. The summit offers notable vistas. Eastward lies the emerald chain marking the middle Rio Grande Valley with Albuquerque stretching across the valley to the Sandia Mountains beyond. Westward lies the Rio Puerco Valley and Mt. Taylor, rising to 12,000 ft. Crossing the Rio Puerco is a Parker through truss bridge. The bridge received substantial repairs in 1957. However, its reinforced concrete approaches and superstructure date to its construction, and the original bridge plates remain affixed to the headwalls of the reinforced concrete Although I-40 closely parallels this portion of Route 66, causing a slight deviation from the original alignment for less than a quarter mile at the westbound I-40 exit at Rio Puerco, the historic alignment, cross-section template, and surrounding landscape remain largely intact.

8. Statement of Significance

Although this portion of the highway was not paved and officially designated as Route 66 until 1937, it was included as mileage in the state's Federal Aid Projects (FAP 178-A and B) in 1932, anticipating its inclusion as a part of Route 66. Federal funding was then used to construct the Rio Puerco Bridge in 1933. When the bridge, to be included as an individual property in a separate multiple property submission treating the historic bridges of New Mexico, was completed many travellers used the so-called "Laguna Cutoff" rather than the official alignment of Route 66, which was several miles longer. Many who travelled the highway during the period of significance recall the vistas at Nine Mile Hill, especially the views of Mt. Taylor and of Albuquerque at night, as some of the most inspiring in the American West. This section of state-maintained Route 66 is significant for its association with the rise of automobile tourism in New Mexico and thus is eligible under Criterion A.
