The Boyd-Cothern House is architecturally significant as one of two pre-Civil War log dogtrots in Lawrence Co. The residence retains a high degree of integrity because of the unaltered interior rooms and the center hall which remains open.	
Historically, it has remained within the same family for six generations since its construction, and the family possesses the original land patent granted for homesteading. It is also associated with the old Bogue Chitto- Holmsville Rd. which passed in front of the house (now the rear facade). Traces of the old road are still visible.	in,
