The structure wherein the Saquache Museum display is housed was splanned some time in the year 1873. Building was erected in 1874 and used as a school. It was originally, a large one room building one story in height. The walls are very thick. The building being adobe has a gabled roof tapering on both sides from a wood beam. Wood shingles covered the original roof of boards. These have been replaced by rubberoid shingles which serve the purpose quite well. The color of the building is gray with patches of cement used in repair. Windows are deep seated and high. Of simple construction, the building has no extra trim and keeps to the old outline outside. Inside, partitions have been added to make seven rooms including a small reading nook and small space for storage. Floors are of pine.

The jail adjoins the school and was built in 1908. It is a marvel of protective confinement with its steel center block of cells, a front office and women's cell equipped with heavy iron bars and doors. The walls have been left as the prisoners decorated them. The jail was in use until 1959 when a new jail was erected near the present courthouse.

The legal land description of the museum building shows it is in the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 12, Township 44 North, Range 7 East of the New Mexicon Meridian. It was patented from the United States to Nathaneal Russell January 30, 1875. The Russell's Addition was Platted as an addition to the town of Saguache April 9, 1875. The Saguache Town Company deeded the property to Saguache County June 7, 1875. The Plat shows this property to be described as Lot I in Block I, Russell's Addition to the Town of Saguache.

A room was added in 1972 with one side of the jail acting as a wall on the south end of the room and the east wall being a part of the west wall of the old building. A entrance porch was built joining both jail and old building to make a blending structure to conform with the overall appearance desired.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The county of Saguache was organized by an act of the territorian legislature of Colorado, approved December 29, 1866.

Saguache is an Indian word. It means Water at the Blue Earth, and is pronounced Sa-Watch. Many old timers referred to it as Si-Watch.

The first settlement was a mile southeast of the present site and was known as Milton. The founding year was 1867.

This was Ute country when the early day settlers first arrived. The great peace-maker Chief Ouray and his wife Chipeta roamed the area with members of their tribe. They warred with and prevailed over other tribes only to lose to the white men.

Saguache is the County Seat of Saguache County. It serves a wide area, and has, since The Saguache Town Company was organized in February, on the seventh day, in 1874. The land was donated by seven ranchmen; and on June 15th, 1874, the matter of a school was considered.

Saguache is blessed with a setting of natural beauty. The Saguache Range lies to the west of the town and the Sangre de Cristos to the east. Sangre de Cristo means "blood of Christ". It was named for its sunrise and sunset coloring ranging in shades of pastel to blood-red. The range was given its name by the Spanish people who penetrated the valley as early as 1591.

The structure is an example of early day pioneer building made to stand the ravages of time. The building is in fair condition except for the floors which need some repair. The 1908 jail roof is covered with a metal sheet material made to appear like a shingle one and is in good condition. Its most famous tenant was Alfred Packer, notorious for his cannibalism episode in the mountain.

The building has been loaned to the museum board for the fine display gleaned from local families supporting it with gracious gifts and loans. The museum is gaining a reputation continued on page 2

for being one of the best of its kind in the country and the exhibit with the old building will be of great service depicting a pioneer era for generations to come.

The museum building is one of the oldest structures in Saguache. It is the only museum in Saguache and is open to the public.

The old reason for the structure has not been neglected-the museum contains a school room of pioneer order. It is also most closely oriented to the education of the community as regards their heritage. The building saw much use as a meeting place for county and town business in the early history of Saguache which lends great significance. Typical of all early schools in small communities, it served a great many of the social and political needs of the community. The very first meeting of county officers was held in Nathan Russell's old corral. Nathan, the man who donated the site to the town for the school building, was the first anglo to arrive in Saguache. The year was 1866. He founded the first settlement that was to grow into the town of Saguache.
