Narrative Description

This single-story coursed stone residence is rectangular in plan except for a recessed corner to provide a covered entry at the northeast corner of the entry elevation. Originally, this small porch with a wooden floor housed two entrances. The narrow dimension of the rectangle parallels the street. The roof is hipped wood shingle, and has a very modest overhang with a narrow flat fascia and boxed soffit. The roof is a complete rectangle and projects over the entry, noted above. The cantilevered porch roof corner is supported by a single turned wooden column. The sandstone walls are composed of coursed cut stone of varying lengths with single simple stone beam lintels and single stone sills. All stone work is pitched face. The stonework is coursed, as noted, but not precise in its alignment. Smeared mortar joints are finished with a raised bead to lend the impression of coursed ashlar. The stone walls have been painted. All windows are individually placed in the walls with approximately equal spacing between window penetrations. The entry elevation features a large cottage window that is embellished with a stained glass transom light. Individual windows are wood double-hung 1-over-1 units.

This residence also retains a small wooden addition on its back end. This addition dates to the historic period and contains a four-light fixed window, a six-panel wooden door, a hipped porch roof and a concrete foundation. The addition is sided with pre-World War II siding.

Note: The three residences at 805, 809 and 813 West Watson are very similar in size, style, and construction and form a small specialized subdivision within the block.

Narrative Statement of Significance

This residence is significant because it is an excellent example of historic stone masonry construction in Lewistown in the early 1900s. The use of coursed, pitched-face cut stone with smear mortar joints finished with a raised bead to lend an impression of coursed ashlar was a technique commonly employed by Lewistown's earliest stone masons. As was typical in communities across the country, early buildings were constructed of materials found near the building site--stone, logs and sod. Materials were prepared by the builders themselves, rather than in distant mills, kilns or factories. In Lewistown, local sandstone could be easily gathered or quarried and the stone building traditions imported by the earliest settlers provided a natural solution to the housing needs created by population growth in the days prior to improved transportation.

Built to serve a burgeoning population in Lewistown in 1905, this house is one of three nearly identical houses owned by John Charters as investment property. This example and its two neighbors at 809 and 813 West Watson feature simple rectangular plans with hipped roofs. While this roof design required a more complex framing, it used fewer long-spanning rafters and thus was less expensive to erect. The three stone houses, unique in Lewistown, remained in group ownership through three owners until 1922. This stone residence maintains historic integrity of design, location, setting, materials, and workmanship. The sandstone walls have been painted, which is reversible.
