1. <u>Name</u>: Mauricio Portillo Homestead, survey numbers 91,92

2. Location: approximately 200' east of Highway 61 and 1 mile south of junction with Highway 90

4. <u>Owner</u>: Santiago and Bersabe V. Hinojosa, Box 121, Hanover, N.M. 88041

7. Description: Photo 47; map 11. House: photos 47,48; center hall plan; stone rubble foundation rising ca. 6" above ground; unstuccoed adobe; corrugated metal, pyramidal hipped roof with monitor ventilator; 2/2 double hung windows; single doors; w/d/w symmetry on east facade, d/wdw/d symmetry on east facade with outside doors opening into rooms and windows touching sides of center door to hall (photo 48); cut-out porch railing (photo 49); gable roofed room added to NW corner; shed roofed addition on south side. Barn: photos 50,51; rectangular; stone rubble foundation up ca. 3" above ground level; unstuccoed adobe, one section of open brick work for ventilation (photo 54); corrugated metal hipped roof; 3 single doors on east side, 1 single door on west shed: photo 50, center; unstuccoed adobe; corrugated side. metal hipped roof.

8. Significance: Mauricio Portillo, an early settler of the area, came from Mexico, probably Chihuahua. About 1890, he built the house which forms the center of this complex: it meets Criterion A as a prominent reminder of the early settlement of Grant County. The house belongs to a group of hip-roofed, center hall plan houses which have been studied in Southern Arizona but only noted in southern New Mexico. As a result, the house may offer important information on the spread of this house type across the Southwest. The adobe barn is the largest in the valley and has a unique ventilator wall. Both the house and barn meet Criterion C as excellent examples of their respective types. Together with one shed, the house and barn form one of the most important historic farmsteads in the valley, which as a result, meets Criterion A as a reminder of the historic importance of agriculture in the valley.
