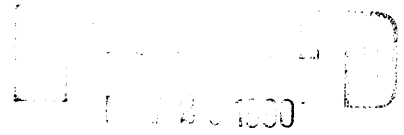

School #20 is a one-story frame, single bay, rectangular plan building constructed ca. 1890 in a gable front plan. The school was built with one large room with no partition walls. The school has a stone pier foundation, gable roof of metal standing seam, and exterior of weatherboard siding. On the main (east) facade is the main entrance with an original five panel wood door and a single light transom. On the north and south facades are three bays with each bay containing an original four-over-four rectangular wood sash window. On the west facade there is an interior wall brick flue and no fenestration.

The interior of the school is one large room with a raised platform and blackboards located along the walls. The only other major interior feature is tongue-in-groove siding on the walls.

School #20 is located on a small lot in a rural section of the county. To the east of the school is Stack Road. There are no associated site features.

PROPERTY TYPE: Educational Buildings

School #20 is significant under criterion A for its association with the public school system of the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The school is one of several dozen which were built during this period in rural sections of the county to serve local students. School #20 is one of the best preserved of these schools and retains its original design and detailing.

The latter part of the 19th century witnessed significant new funding for the construction of public schools in Larue County. Many new one-room frame schoolbuildings were constructed in these years and were built throughout the county. These schools were the primary centers for education for students in the rural areas and they remained in operation until consolidation in the 1950s. School #20 was built ca. 1890 to serve students of the area and was used until vacated during the period of consolidation. The building is presently vacant.

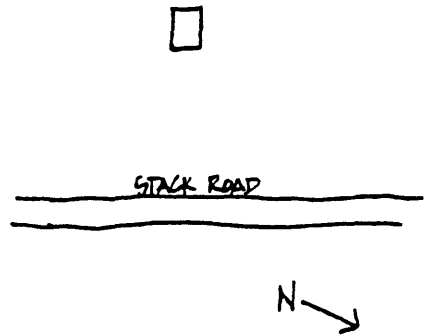

Verbal Boundary Description: The boundary for School #20 is illustrated as part of lot 23 on accompanying Larue County tax map 27. The boundary is a rectangle measuring 50' by 100' with the northwest corner located 10 feet from the northwest foundation of the building and the southeast corner located ten feet from the southeast foundation of the building.

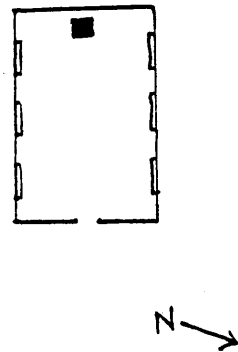
Boundary Justification: The boundary for School #20 includes all property historically associated with the school.
