18. either side are setbacks. The bays adjacent to the center pavillion have 4, coupled windows per floor. The end bays have 3 windows with keystones per floor. The left side has a projecting wind with double doors and a fanlight and a palladian window on the 2nd floor. This wing is further articulated by pilasters with stone capitals. Behind this wing is another wing with portice. A new wing projects from the right and is in brick with more comtemporary windows treatment.

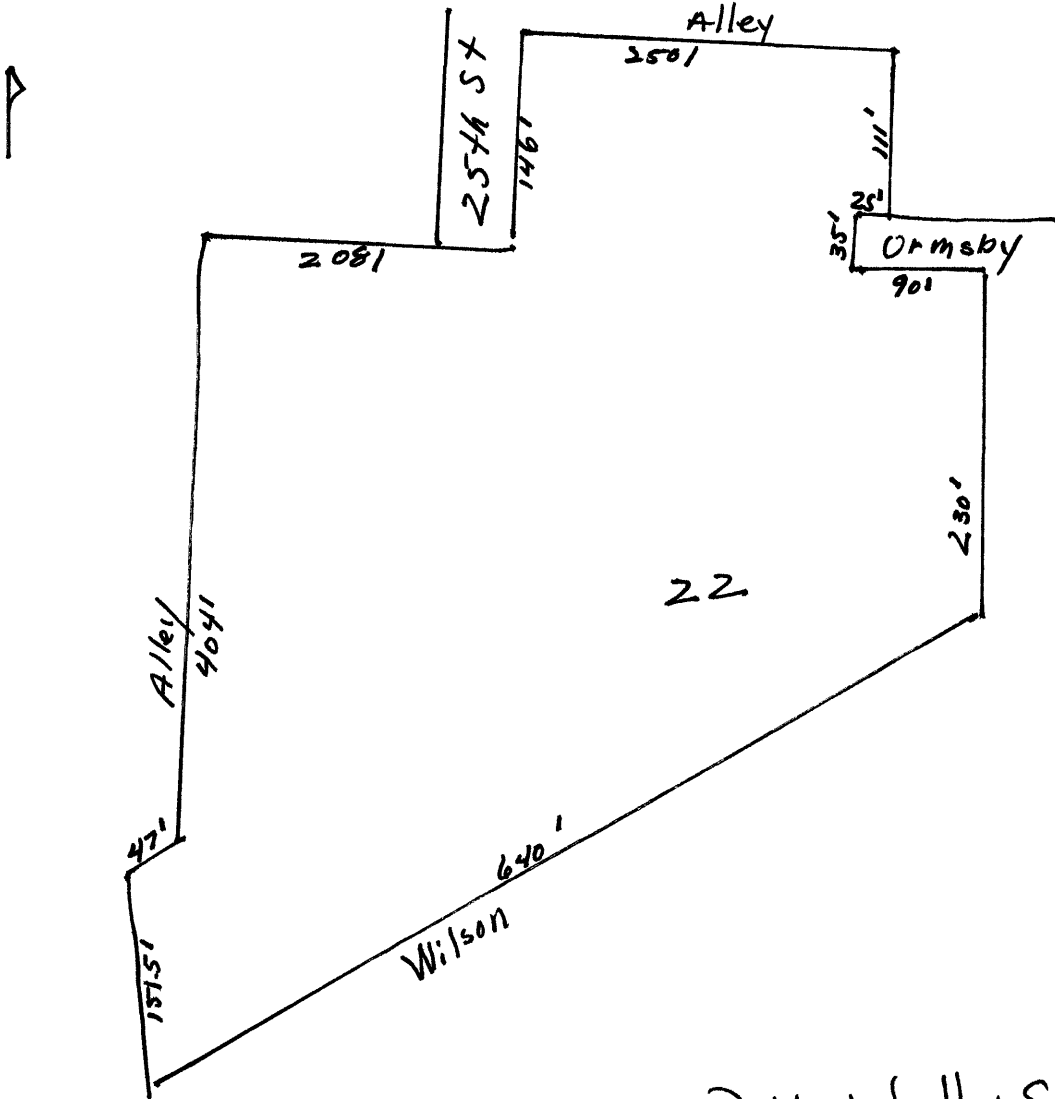
