


Physical Description

This tall two-story frame house on 6th Street in downtown Little Rock is similar to the adjacent house on the west at 601 Rock, designed by Charles Thompson around the same time for the same owner. It is slightly less ornamental than the Rock Street house, but shares the same tall boxy massing with half the principal facade recessed; here the porch is sheltered by the high hipped roof which caps the structure. Two paired, monumental, unfluted Ionic columns support the corner of the porch and the entablature with dentil molding and modillion blocks at the cornice level. Decorative gable roofed dormers appear at each elevation; the front dormer features a Palladian-like window embellished with colonnettes. The front door contains a single beveled glass pane; other windows are plate glass sash variety.

Statement of Significance

Designed for Walter Nash ca. 1907, the house at 409 E. 6th Street in Little Rock is a tall two-story frame building with Georgian Revival influence. Charles L. Thompson designed this house as well as the house at 601 Rock (PU-114) as rental property for Nash. The 409 E. 6th house is slightly less ornamental but features the same massing with half of the front elevation recessed. The 409 E. 6th Nash House is covered by a hipped roof marked by gable roofed dormers on each elevation. The dormer on the principal facade features a Palladian-like window decorated with colonnettes. Paired unfluted Ionic columns support the corner of the porch. The house appears original to the ca. 1907 Thompson design. Located within the MacArthur Park Historic District, the 409 E. 6th Nash House assumes a greater historic significance as part of the Charles L. Thompson and associates design collection. With its emphasis on decorative details and the recessed half of the facade, this house is an unusual and attractive variation of the firm's many two-story houses with hipped roof and Colonial Revival details.
