Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The parish church of Santiago Apóstol in Fajardo occupies almost all of the north side of the town plaza, and is oriented on an east-west axis. It is enclosed by a concrete balustrade wall modulated by pillars. Metal grillwork gates close the entrances corresponding to the lateral doors of the building.

The original 1776 church was destroyed in 1867 by an earthquake. In 1869, a project for the construction of a new church designed by Don Pedro A. Beibal was begun. The side walls and the marble floor tiles of the old church were used.

The building consists of a nave and two side aisles. Open arcades (five arches each) resting on simple pillars divide the space. There are six bays plus the apse/sacristies. The first bay includes the vestibule. On the left, an interesting spiral wooden staircase leads up to the choir loft. The next five bays enclose the main public space, which is presently roofed with a gabled pitched wooden structure covered with corrugated metal sheets. The square apse is crowned by a brick lanterned dome. Acoustic tiles in the ceiling of the nave, and ornamental stone work in the apse are recent additions.

The facade is dominated by a square bell tower, with rustication on its two lower levels. The third level holds bells contained within open arches. The entrance is sheltered by a massive portico. Two small windows flank the bell tower and porch, helping to define the side aisles in the interior. The side facades are simple, with one door and four windows.

The most serious alteration is the addition of an oversized parish house to the presbytery, which totally obscures the rear of the building.



Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The parish church of Santiago Apóstol in Fajardo is of historical and architectural significance. Fray Iñigo Abbad describes the town in 1776 as having nine houses, including a church. The first church was destroyed during an earthquake in 1776 and rebuilt in 1869. The building retains most of its 19th century construction and design, which actually encompassed the side walls and floors of the first 18th century church. It is one of the few examples in which a porch tower was designed as an integral part of the church. This is one of the oldest buildings in Fajardo. The traditional relationship of the main plaza, city hall and church is maintained in accordance with Spanish Crown ordinances at the time the town was founded.
