III. HISTORY	HISTORICAL NARRATIVE (FROM ORIGINS TO PRESENT): This house is apparently the one represented at this address on the Sanborn (Insurance) Maps of 1889 and 1895. It was, reputedly, built for John Spencer Roberts, who was founder of Georgia Webbing and Tape Co. By 1896, Joseph Hecht i here. In the city directory of 1898-1899, he's listed (with his wife, Adele) and is associate with "R.J. Cohen's" (aBroad Street saloon). In 1900, Hecht is again listed at this address, but he's now manager of "Hecht Candy Co." (wholesale manufacturers of candy on Broad Street). In the 1902 directory, Hecht is at another address.		

LEVEL OF SIGNIFICANCE: Local N.R. AREA(S) OF SIGNIFICANCE: Local History, Architecture

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (ARCHITECTURAL AND HISTORICAL): Local History: This house is significant as it was the home of John Spencer Roberts, who was founder of Georgia Webbing and Tape Co. It is also significant as it was the home of Joseph Hecht, who lived here during the late 1890's and became manager of what appears to be his own candy business. Architecture: This Greek Revival house is the only house in Columbus to use ashlar block rather than flush paneling under the portico. It has unusually fine proportioning and the interior woodwork and plastering are exceptionally fine.
