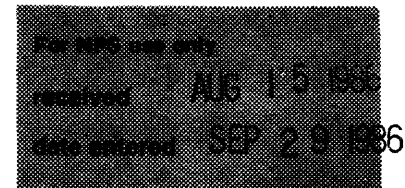

Samuel Sanchez Barns, ill. 117, 80 yards SW of
the Sanchez house along private farm roadway. Vic. Los Brazos.

4. Owner: Miguel R. and Cleofas C. Sanchez, Box 131,
Los Ojos, 87551

7. Description: Smaller barn: horizontal beams with dovetail
notches and box splicing; corrugated roof; 2 doors; 1 window;
remains of hewn log structure with box notching to north.
Larger barn: horizontal beams with dovetail notches with box
splicing; corrugated roof; 3 doors; 1 window. Outbuilding:
vertical planks.

8. Significance: Probably built in the 1880's, these barns
with their dovetail notches are excellent examples of local
builders incorporating new building techniques into traditional
building styles. The proximity of these barns to the site of
the original speculative town of Parkview (see Part I, p. 9)
probably accounts for their use of dovetail notching. The
Swedish immigrant residents of Parkview introduced this
notching style to the area. These barns likely reuse logs from
that settlement which was abandoned shortly after 1880.

10. Acreage: less than one. UTM Ref: 13 360800 4069760

Boundary: A rectangle, measuring approximately 200' by 80'
formed by lines parallel to and ten feet from the barns' walls.
Since this property is unplatted, the boundary has been drawn
tightly to include only the historic structures.
